15	WHEREAS, child care organizations nationwide are recognizing Child Care Providers on
16	this day;
17	WHEREAS, more than half of children under the age of six nationwide are estimated to
17	WILETEN, more than that of emitter the age of six hadronwide are estimated to
18	spend some time in a nonparental care arrangement on a weekly basis;
19	WHEREAS, these care arrangements provide critical enrichment opportunities, nurture
20	development for children of all backgrounds, and are a vital building block of the District's
21	economy;
22	WHEREAS, child care providers serve a vital role in our community, not only caring for
23	and educating our children but also supporting parent participation in the workforce;
24	WHEREAS, the COVID-19 pandemic has created substantial hardship for child care
25	providers and the families of the District of Columbia who depend on them;
26	WHEREAS, child care providers continued to meet the needs of families during the
27	COVID-19 pandemic while working to safeguard the health of children and staff and navigating
28	challenges to financial stability;
29	WHEREAS, the District of Columbia recognizes these hardships and has provided much-
30	needed relief to providers to help sustain the viability of child care during the COVID-19

pandemic through various policies and grant programs, including increased compensation for	
early educators, increased reimbursement rates for providers serving children in the child care	
subsidy program, \$15.7 million through the DC Child Care Provider Relief Fund to provide	
emergency relief for child care facilities, more than \$400,000 in grants to child care providers	
through the DC Access to Quality Child Care Expansion COVID-19 Emergency Response Grant	
program, \$38 Million for the Child Care Stabilization Grant program to support a strong	
recovery for DC child care providers; \$11.8 million in grants from the DC Child Care Road to	
Recovery Fund to support increased costs incurred by serving medically vulnerable children and	
offset reduced revenues from lower attendance, among other supports;	
WHEREAS, our future depends on the quality of the early childhood experiences	
provided to young children today, support for high-quality child care represents a worthy	
commitment to our children's future; and	
WHEREAS, the Council urges all residents of the District of Columbia to recognize	
Child Care Providers for their important work.	
RESOLVED, BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this	
resolution may be cited as the "Child Care Provider Appreciation Day Recognition Resolution of	
2022".
