A PROPOSED RESOLUTION

IN THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA

To approve, on an emergency basis, the transfer of jurisdiction over a portion of Reservation 405 in the District of Columbia from the Department of the Interior, National Park Service to the District of Columbia.

RESOLVED, BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this resolution may be cited as the “Transfer of Jurisdiction Over a Portion of Reservation 405, S.O. 21-07525, Emergency Approval Resolution of 2022.”

Sec. 2. Pursuant to Section 1 of an Act to authorize the transfer of jurisdiction over public land in the District of Columbia, approved May 20, 1932 (47 Stat. 161; D.C. Official Code §10-111), the Council of the District of Columbia approves the transfer of jurisdiction of approximately 126,167 square feet comprising a portion of Reservation 405 (comprising a portion of Lot 809 in Square 5450, a portion of Lot 802 in Square 5464, a portion of Lot 805 in Square 5465, and portions of Lots 15, 800, 801, and 802 in Square 5467), as shown on the Surveyor’s plat in S.O. 21-07525, from the Department of the Interior, National Park Service to the District of Columbia.

Sec. 3. Transmittal.

The Secretary to the Council of the District of Columbia shall transmit a copy of this resolution, upon its adoption, to the Mayor, the Surveyor of the District of Columbia, the Executive Director of the National Capital Planning Commission, the Speaker of the United States House of

Representatives, the President Pro Tempore of the United States, the Director of the National Park Service, and the Regional Director of the National Capital Region of the National Park Service.

Sec. 4. Fiscal impact statement.

The Council adopts the fiscal impact statement in the committee report as the fiscal impact statement required by section 602(c)(3) of the District of Columbia Home Rule Act, approved December 24, 1973 (87 Stat. 813; D.C. Official Code § 1-206.02(c)(3)).

Sec. 5. Effective date.

This resolution shall take effect immediately.
