42 To celebrate and recognize the “National Library Workers Day” in the District of Columbia.

44 WHEREAS, National Library Week is a national observance sponsored by the American
45 Library Association (ALA) and libraries across the country each April;

WHEREAS, National Library Week recognizes contributions of libraries for the ways libraries benefit individuals and communities that includes Library Giving Day, Book Mobile Day, Take Action for Libraries Day, Citizen Science Day and Library Workers Day;

WHEREAS, National Library Workers Day observance takes place annually on the Tuesday of National Library Week;

WHEREAS, The District of Columbia Public Library (DCPL) was established as an independent agency that would serve as the “people’s university;”

WHEREAS, DCPL includes a central library and 25 neighborhood libraries that provide information, programing, meeting spaces and lending resources in hardcopy and digital formats;

WHEREAS, DCPL has 579 employees;

WHEREAS, Library workers in the District of Columbia work hard and are dedicated;

RESOLVED, BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, that this resolution be cited as the “National Library Workers Day Recognition Ceremonial Resolution of 2022”.

Sec. 2. The Council recognizes and celebrates National Library Workers Day on April 5, 2022.

Sec. 3. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon the first date of publication in the District of Columbia Register.
