B24-0620 – Juneteenth History and Planning Commission Establishment Act of 2022

On Thursday, May 19, 2022, Councilmember Anita Bonds will hold a public hearing to discuss B24-0620, the "Juneteenth History and Planning Commission Establishment Act of 2022".

B24-0620, the "Juneteenth History and Planning Commission Establishment Act of 2022" would establish the District Juneteenth History and Planning Commission to plan for activities in celebration of Juneteenth in the District of Columbia and to educate the public about the history of Juneteenth not only in the District, but across the country. This Commission would plan for an annual Juneteenth celebration and coordinate year-round education about Juneteenth and Black history more broadly. The Commission would include the director of African-American Civil War Museum, representatives from the District's historically Black colleges and universities, the director of the Office of African American Affairs, and fifteen community representatives – two nominated by the Mayor and one nominated by each Councilmember.
