A RESOLUTION

IN THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA

To declare the existence of an emergency with respect to the need to approve Contract No. NFPHC-NSD-21-C-00027 Modifications between the Not-for-Profit Hospital Corporation, commonly known as United Medical Center (“Hospital”), and Maxim Healthcare Staffing Services, Inc., for the provision of nurse staffing services pertaining to the emergency department, intensive care unit, and telemetry services, and to authorize payment for the services received and to be received under the Contract.

RESOLVED, BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this resolution may be cited as the “Contract No. NFPHC-NSD-21-C-00027 Modifications between the Not-for-Profit Hospital Corporation and Maxim Healthcare Staffing Services, Inc. Approval and Payment Authorization Emergency Declaration Resolution of 2022”.

Sec. 2. (a) There exists an immediate need to approve Contract No. NFPHC-NSD-21-C-00027 Modifications (“Contract”) between the Not-for-Profit Hospital Corporation (“Hospital”) and Maxim Healthcare Staffing Services, Inc. for the provision of nurse staffing services pertaining to the emergency department, intensive care unit, and

telemetry services, and to authorize payment for the services received and to be received under this Contract.

(b) The Council approved the base year of the Contract on June 29, 2021 as A24-115. The base year had a total value of \$3,500,000 and a 12 month period of December 10, 2020 – December 9, 2021.

(c) UMC was unable to secure alternate nurse staffing services before the base year ended. To avoid disruption during the holiday period, the parties entered into a partial exercise of option year 1. Modification #5 had a value of \$143,835.62 for the period of December 10, 2021 through December 24, 2021.

(d) Modification #6 in the amount of \$1,726,027.40 and period of December 25, 2021 through June 22, 2022 was approved by the Council on May 3, 2022 (A24-416) after UMC was unsuccessful finding an alternative vendor.

(e) More time was needed to research possible staffing alternatives, so the parties now propose entering Modification #7 for \$1,500,000.00 and period of June 23, 2022 through September 30, 2022

(f) If Proposed Modification #7 is approved, the combined value of the partial exercise of option year 1 (December 10, 2021 – September 30, 2022) would have an aggregate value that exceeds \$1 million in a 12-month period, and therefore Council approval is necessary.

57 (g) Without this approval, Maxim Healthcare Staffing Services, Inc. cannot be
58 paid for these critical services provided and to be provided in excess of \$999,999.99.

59 Sec. 3. The Council determines that the circumstances enumerated in section 2
60 constitute emergency circumstances making it necessary that Contract No. NFPHC-NSD-
61 21-C-00027 Modifications between the Not-for-Profit Hospital Corporation and Maxim
62 Healthcare Staffing Services, Inc. Approval and Payment Authorization Emergency
63 Amendment Act of 2022, be adopted after a single reading.

64 Sec. 4. This resolution shall take effect immediately.
