22	act may be cited as the "Targeted Historic Preservation Assistance Congressional Review
23	Emergency Amendment Act of 2022".
24	Sec. 2. Section 11b of the Historic Landmark and Historic District Protection Act of 1978,
25	effective March 2, 2007 (D.C. Law 16-189; D.C. Official Code § 6-1110.02), is amended by
26	adding a new subsection (g-1) to read as follows:
27	"(g-1)(1) A grant may be made to a qualified taxpayer under subsection (e)(1) of this
28	section who owns a unit in a multifamily common interest community, as defined in section
29	2232(3) of the Common Interest Community Repairs Amendment Act of 2018, effective October
30	30, 2018 (D.C. Law 22-168, D.C. Official Code § 42-2071(3)) ("Common Interest Community
31	Repairs Amendment Act"), located in Square 2594, for the cost of rehabilitation by the common
32	interest community attributable to the taxpayer.
33	"(2) The Mayor shall ensure that all funds granted to a taxpayer who owns a unit in

- a common interest community are used to pay for the approved rehabilitation work.
