

A PROPOSED RESOLUTION

IN THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA

To declare the existence of an emergency, due to congressional review, with respect to the need to provide for comprehensive policing and justice reform for District residents and visitors, and for other purposes.

RESOLVED, BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this resolution may be cited as the “Comprehensive Policing and Justice Reform Congressional Review Emergency Declaration Resolution of 2022”.

Sec. 2. (a) On April 5, 2022, the Council passed the Comprehensive Policing and Justice Reform Emergency Amendment Act of 2022, effective April 7, 2022 (D.C. Act 24-370; 69 DCR 3370) (“emergency act”). The emergency act is projected to expire on July 6, 2022.

(b) On April 19, 2022, the Council passed the Comprehensive Policing and Justice Reform Temporary Amendment Act of 2022, enacted on May 9, 2022 (D.C. Act 24-403; 69 DCR 5042) (“temporary act”). The temporary act is undergoing congressional review and is projected to take effect on September 29, 2022.

(c) This emergency legislation is necessary to prevent a gap in the law between the expiration of the emergency act and the effective date of the temporary act.

Sec. 3. The Council of the District of Columbia determines that the circumstances enumerated in section 2 constitute emergency circumstances making it necessary that the
