

A BILL

IN THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA

To declare the existence of an emergency, due to congressional review, with respect to the need to amend the Ban on Non-Compete Agreements Amendment Act of 2020 to postpone the applicability of the law to October 1, 2022.

RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this act may be cited as the “Ban on Non-Compete Agreements Applicability Congressional Review Emergency Declaration Resolution of 2022”.

Sec. 2. (a) On March 1, 2022, the Council passed, and on March 28, 2022, the Mayor signed, the Ban on Non-Compete Agreements Applicability Emergency Amendment Act of 2022, effective March 28, 2022 (D.C. Act 24-350; 69 DCR 2622) (“emergency act”), which will expire on June 26, 2022.

(b) On April 5, 2022, the Council passed on second reading, and on May 3, 2022 the Mayor signed, the Ban on Non-Compete Agreements Applicability Temporary Amendment Act of 2022, enacted May 3, 2022 (D.C. Act 24-392; 69 DCR 4406) (“temporary act”), which is not expected to become law until July 20, 2022.

(c) This emergency legislation is necessary to prevent a gap in the law between the expiration of the emergency act and the effective date of the temporary act.

29           Sec. 3. The Council of the District of Columbia determines that the circumstances  
30 enumerated in section 2 constitute emergency circumstances making it necessary that the Ban on  
31 Non-Compete Agreements Applicability Congressional Review Emergency Amendment Act of  
32 2022 be adopted after a single reading.

33           Sec. 4. This resolution shall take effect immediately.
