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22 To amend, on an emergency basis, the Advisory Neighborhood Commissions Act of 1975 to  
23 provide that certain amounts in the Advisory Neighborhood Commissions Technical  
24 Support and Assistance Fund be used for allotments to ANCs in Fiscal Year 2023; and  
25 the Advisory Neighborhood Commission Boundaries Act of 2022 to require individuals  
26 in possession of ANC physical assets to return such assets to the successor ANC, unless  
27 an individual is a Commissioner for the successor ANC as of January 2, 2023.  
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29 BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this  
30 act may be cited as the “Advisory Neighborhood Commission Allotment Emergency Act of  
31 2022”.

32 Sec. 2. Section 13a of the Advisory Neighborhood Commissions Act of 1975, effective  
33 December 3, 2020 (D.C. Law 23-149; D.C. Official Code § 1-309.13a), is amended by adding a  
34 new subsection (c-1) to read as follows:

35 “(c-1) Notwithstanding subsection (c) of this section, in Fiscal Year 2023:

36 “(1) \$799,688 in the Fund shall be used to provide quarterly allotments to  
37 Advisory Neighborhood Commissions in accordance with section 738(e) of the District of  
38 Columbia Home Rule Act, approved December 24, 1973 (87 Stat. 824; D.C. Official Code § 1-

39 207.38(e)), and section 3(c) of the Advisory Neighborhood Commission Boundaries Act of  
40 2022, effective August 10, 2022 (D.C. Law 24-148; 69 DCR 11394) (ANC Boundaries Act of  
41 2022); and

42 “(2) \$25,000 in the Fund shall be allotted on a per capita basis, based on the 2020  
43 census population of each Advisory Neighborhood Commission, to the following Advisory  
44 Neighborhood Commissions established by section 2 of the ANC Boundaries Act of 2022;  
45 provided, that the Advisory Neighborhood Commission has fulfilled the requirements of section  
46 16(a) and (c), as determined by the Office of Advisory Neighborhood Commissions:

47 “(A) ANC 1E;

48 “(B) ANC 2G;

49 “(C) ANC 3A;

50 “(D) ANC 4E;

51 “(E) ANC 5F; and

52 “(F) ANC 8F.”.

53 Sec. 3. Section 3(a) of the Advisory Neighborhood Commission Boundaries Act of 2022,  
54 effective August 10, 2022 (D.C. Law 24-148; D.C. Official Code § 1-309.51(a)), is amended as  
55 follows:

56 (a) Designate the existing text as paragraph (1).

57 (b) Add a new paragraph (2) to read as follows:

58 “(2) An individual who possesses a physical asset belonging to an ANC shall  
59 relinquish the asset to the ANC that is the successor in interest to the asset unless, as of January  
60 2, 2023, the individual is a duly elected Commissioner for the successor ANC.”.

66           This act shall take effect following approval by the Mayor (or in the event of veto by the  
67 Mayor, action by the Council to override the veto), and shall remain in effect for no longer than  
68 90 days, as provided for emergency acts of the Council of the District of Columbia in section  
69 412(a) of the District of Columbia Home Rule Act, approved December 24, 1973 (87 Stat. 788;  
70 D.C. Official Code § 1-204.12(a)).
