On Tuesday, October 11, 2022, Councilmember Anita Bonds will hold a public hearing to discuss B24-0653 – Period Equity Righting an Injustice of District Residents (PERIOD) Act of 2022.

B24-0653 Period Equity Righting an Injustice of District Residents Act of 2022 ("PERIOD Act") requires the provision of free period products in District buildings and government operated spaces. This bill would reduce these risks for District residents and visitors by providing free period products in public buildings and facilities serving vulnerable populations. The inability to access period products can create serious health consequences. Women, transgender men, and non-binary people who lack access to menstrual products are more likely to reuse products or use products for too long, which puts those individuals at higher risk for infection and other conditions that require medical care.
