Council Chairman Phil Mendelson announces a public hearing before the Committee of the Whole on **Bill 24-707**, the "Containing Litter and Ensuring Adequate Neighborhood (CLEAN) Collections Amendment Act of 2022." The hearing will be held at **2:30 p.m.** (or immediately following the preceding hearing) on Friday, October **21**, 2022 via Zoom Video Conference Broadcast.

The purpose of <u>Bill 24-707</u> is to amend the Sustainable Solid Waste Management Amendment Act of 2014 to require private solid waste collectors who provide services to multifamily residential properties to supply properties with solid waste containers that can store the equivalent of 32 gallons of solid waste per residential unit and to require collections services at least twice a week at these properties. Violations of the act would result in a civil penalty of no less than \$500 against the private solid waste collector. Regulation of how private businesses – in this case, solid waste collectors – provide services is largely within the jurisdiction of the Department of Consumer and Regulatory Affairs.

Testimony is limited to four minutes. We will make every effort to fulfill timely requests, although alternatives may be offered. Requests received in less than five business days may not be fulfilled.
