LIST OF CAH'S ACTIVE MEMORANDA OF UNDERSTANDING (MOU) (as of January 31, 2022)

a) CAH's MOU with the District's state humanities council, Humanities DC. These two parties enter into a grants and sub-grants-related MOU annually, in accordance with D.C. Official Code Section 39-205.01.

Date Entered: February 8, 2022 / Anticipated Termination Date: April 21, 2023

b) CAH's MOU with the Department of General Services regarding the CAH public art project associated with the installation of new artwork at the newly named "Marion S. Barry, Jr. Building" (formerly "441 Judiciary Square").

Date Entered: February 21, 2022 / Anticipated Termination Date: September 30, 2022

c) CAH's MOU with the Department of Human Resources (DCHR) regarding DCHR's provision to CAH of human resources (HR)-related "Policy and Compliance Services" and "Suitability / Background Checks". Note: CAH was required to procure these HR services after it recently became an independent government agency. These service costs are connected to compliance services that include criminal background checks, drug testing (random and general) and fitness for duty testing (two types).

Date Entered: October 1, 2020 / Termination Date: September 30, 2021

d) CAH's MOU (and subsequent MOU Amendment Agreement) with the Department of Small and Local Business Development (DSLBD) regarding the District's annual "Art All Night" celebration of art. Pursuant to the provisions of these two agreements, CAH transferred to DSLBD Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000.00) for the purpose of paying Art All Night-related production expenses.

#### PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The project will commission an artist to design, fabricate, and install a bronze statue commemorating African American attorney, Charles Hamilton Houston for his lifetime of achievements and contributions to the American civil rights movement, education, and the legal profession. He is recognized as the architect behind the legal doctrine that ultimately caused the demise of legalized racial segregation and "separate but equal" in the United States. During his tenure as Dean of the Howard University School of Law, he developed the school's reputation as a major national center for training black lawyers, and as the first special counsel for the NAACP, he led litigation strategies to attack racial housing covenants and segregated schools.

### **CURRENT STATUS**

The first phase of the project was to identify the site where the statue will be installed. After considering a number of locations around the District, including sites on or near Howard Law School and Dunbar High School where he attended, the consensus was to place the statue on Indiana Avenue NW across from the H. Moultrie Courthouse and his law office. The proposed property is owned by the National Park Service (NPS). On May 19, 2021, Senior Advisor Beverly Perry wrote to NPS Area Director Kym Hall to formally request a Transfer of Jurisdiction of the property, a process that is used when the property remains useful and attractive to the federal government, but has unique value to the District of Columbia, or in situations where the property is useful, but the federal government has no immediate plans to use or develop the property. On November 29, 2021, NPS Area Director Hall responded to Senior Advisor Perry's letter, stating that NPS could move forward with a potential transfer. The process has many steps that involves consultation with numerous interested parties, compliance with the National Environmental Policy Act and the National Historic Preservation Act, and approvals by both the National Capital

Planning Commission and the Council of the District of Columbia. The entire transfer process typically takes between one and two years.

#### **GRANT PROGRAMS**

### **Art Bank Program (ABP)**

The DC Commission on the Arts and Humanities Art Bank Program supports visual artists and art acquiring galleries by fine art from metropolitan artists to grow the Art Bank Collection. Artwork in the collection is owned by CAH and loaned to District Government agencies for display in public areas and offices of government buildings.

### **Art Exhibition (Curatorial) Grant Program (AEG)**

The Art Exhibition (Curatorial) Grant Program provides support for the development and public presentation of visual art exhibitions with accompanying programming by District resident curators through grant funding and use of CAH's exhibition space within their building lobby at 200 I Street SE, and/or CAH's online virtual gallery.

### **Arts and Humanities Education Projects (AHEP)**

The Arts and Humanities Education Projects grant is designed to support In-School and Out-of-School-Time arts and humanities projects for children and youth in pre-school through high

school settings. The grant also supports professional development opportunities in the arts and humanities for classroom educators.

### **Arts and Humanities Fellowship Program (AHFP)**

The Arts and Humanities Fellowship Program offers up to \$10,000 fellowships to individual artists whose artistic excellence significantly contributes to the District of Columbia as a world class cultural capital. AHFP recognizes the impact of individual artists within the District of Columbia and supports the vitality that those artists bring to the local community.

### **Color The Curb (CTC)**

This joint agency project is part of DDOT's Arts in the Right-of-Way program and funds artist designs that transform intersections into works of art that increase the safety and visibility of pedestrians while adding visual interest to the area.

### **Juried Exhibition Grant (JEG)**

The Juried Exhibition Grant provides support for District-based artists to exhibit their work in a juried, themed visual art exhibition through grant support and use of CAH's exhibition space within their District-owned building lobby and CAH's virtual platform. If the gallery is unavailable, the exhibition will be installed on the on-line platform only. The FY22 exhibition will be organized around the theme of environmental justice. In their work, artists may address local and/or global questions of ecology, environmentalism, biodiversity, climate change, stewardship, the relationship of climate justice to social justice, and/or other related concepts and issues.

### East of the River (EOR)

The East of the River grant provides access to high-quality arts and humanities experiences for DC residents who live east of the Anacostia River. Activities may be programs or projects that include, but are not limited to, dance, design, folk and traditional arts, literature, media arts, music, theater, and visual arts. Funding may be used to support operational and programmatic costs directly related to the East of the River activities described in the application. Organizations must be headquartered in Wards 7 or 8 in order to be eligible for this grant.

### **Facilities and Buildings (FAB)**

Provides support for cultural facilities capital projects, including project planning, professional services, equipment purchases, renovations, repairs, facility purchase.

### **General Operating Support (GOS)**

The General Operating Support grant provides general operating support for arts, humanities and arts education organizations.

### **Juried Exhibition Grant (JEG)**

The Juried Exhibition Grant provides support for District-based artists to exhibit their work in a juried, themed visual art exhibition through grant support and use of CAH's exhibition space within their District owned building lobby and CAH's virtual platform. If the gallery is unavailable, the exhibition will be installed on the on-line platform only. The FY22 exhibition will be organized around the theme of environmental justice. In their work, artists may address

local and/or global questions of ecology, environmentalism, biodiversity, climate change, stewardship, the relationship of climate justice to social justice, and/or other related concepts and issues.

### LiftOff (LFT)

CAH's LiftOff grant program provides capacity building support to established DC-based arts and humanities nonprofit organizations that face operational and infrastructure challenges that inhibit their organizational and programmatic sustainability.

### **NEA CARES Act**

Relief funding for artists and organizations impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic, utilizing federal funding received from the National Endowment for the Arts as part of the 2020 Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act disbursed through one-time grants.

### **Projects, Events and Festivals (PEF)**

The Projects, Events and Festivals grant provides project support for individuals and organizations to execute projects that promote arts and humanities activities to a diverse range of communities within the District of Columbia. Also, CAH encourages community-based projects that share characteristics such as geographic location, common interests or a collective identity.

### **Public Art Building Communities (PABC)**

Supports the design, fabrication and installation of permanent or temporary public artwork that enhances District neighborhoods by connecting artists and their artwork with communities.

### **Sister Cities Grant (SCG)**

The Sister Cities Grant provides one-time project support and covers travel expenses to foster arts and humanities exchange between the District of Columbia and District of Columbia's Sister Cities.

### **Upstart Capacity-Building Grant (UPS)**

Upstart is designed to support arts and humanities organizations with intensive technical assistance through consulting and funding for core administrative systems, leadership development and operating reserves.

32. Please describe each step of the grant review and approval from grant application, staff review, evaluation panels, Commission committee review and approval, and Commission review and approval. Specifically describe what information is available to reviewers and approvers at each step, such as who applied for the grant.

CAH strives for a grantmaking process that is competitive, fair and balanced, with no prejudice and with support from as many knowledgeable parties as possible. CAH adheres to the processes set forth by the Citywide Grants Manual and Sourcebook along with guidance from the Office of the City Administrator Grants Management Division. The grant application review process is as follows:

- 1. Applications are reviewed by CAH staff for compliance with the requirements set forth by the associated grant guidelines. Applicants that are disqualified prior to the panel process will be identified to the executive director with the appropriate rationale noted. The Grants and Panels Committee will be notified of this information. Applicants will then be notified of their disqualification by CAH staff.
- 2. Prior to or concurrent with the aforementioned step, a public call to panelists is released. CAH grants staff develops a peer review advisory panel for applicants according to grant program, working ensure a diverse and inclusive panel assembly. CAH staff present confirmed panelists to the executive director and, upon his/her approval, submits the slate of panelists to the Grants and Panels Committee for review and approval. CAH staff confirms participation with prospective panelists. Confirmed panelists will receive application materials to begin evaluation no less than three (3) weeks in advance of the in-person panel date and be instructed to insert pre-scores, when applicable.
- 3. Concurrent with the above steps, commissioners will elect panel date(s) of their choosing when each is available to convene said panel.
- 4. On the date of the panel, a commissioner convener ensures that each panelist voices feedback on the applications from the panelists and solicits and monitors any conflict of interest among panelists. During the panel deliberations:
  - Commissioner convener and CAH staff are to remain impartial;
  - Commissioner convener and CAH staff abstain from adjudicating applications or offering extraneous information about an applicant;
  - Commissioner convener and CAH staff will not voice personal opinions on an applicant or add additional information on the applicant; and,
  - Commissioner convener with an identified conflict of interest with any applicant will exit the panel session during deliberation of said applicant.
- 5. CAH staff collect preliminary scores from the peer review advisory panel before the panel assembly day. For project or fellowship panels that do not include in-person applicant participation (live work sample, presentation, etc.), CAH may propose to dismiss the lowest scoring applications in the preliminary ranking from discussion during the in-person panel. If panelists unanimously consent, then any or all of the proposed applications may be dismissed from further discussion. The advisory panel then evaluates, scores and ranks proposals based upon the published review criteria.
  - After panelists submit final scoring in the panel session, CAH staff will review the final applicants ranking with the panelists. Conveners will not solicit input on or engage in funding recommendations from panelists at any time since such conversations will not be considered in the final funding recommendations.
- 6. To ensure impartiality, CAH staff will develop funding recommendations with the organization/individual names hidden. Applicant ward, discipline, and budget, when

- applicable, will remain visible. Afterwards, staff will present funding scenarios to the executive director based on the applicant score and the grant program budget limitations. The executive director will review the recommended funding scenarios against agency strategic initiatives.
- 7. Prior to a subsequent Grants Committee meeting, staff may solicit updated conflict of interest forms from Grants Committee members. Staff will then present funding recommendation(s) to the members, with the commissioner convener noted, to the Committee in a meeting with a quorum of designated Committee members. Occasionally, applicants may have compliance issues that need to be brought to the Committee's attention. In these instances, staff is to note the applicant with concerns by highlighting the recommendation. The Grants Committee may opt to discuss the rationale for the concern (e,g, failure to submit interim or final reports or non-compliance with previous award stipulations). Further action may be warranted, including the removal of that prospective grantee from consideration.

All applicants will be presented to the Grants Committee, including those that were deemed ineligible and those that were dismissed on panel day due to low preliminary scores. Applicant names continue to be hidden from view to ensure impartiality. The Grants Committee will agree upon recommendations and, at that point, the funding recommendation list with the organization/individual names will be made visible. In the event that an adjustment is requested by a commissioner, a majority vote of the Grants Committee is necessary to approve an amendment to the funding recommendations. The final slate of grant funding recommendations will be presented to the full body of commissioners at a subsequent meeting.

- 8. Prior to the full Commission meeting, staff will send each commissioner the slate of grant funding recommendations that are to be presented at the upcoming meeting. The slate will include details on the award, the ranking and other pertinent details without disclosing applicant name. Commissioners are expected to review this information prior to arriving at the full Commission meeting.
- 10. In a publicly open meeting of the full Commission, CAH staff and the Grants Committee Chair will present the slate of recommended grant awards to commissioners. The chair of the Board of Commissioners will announce any known conflicts of interest prior to each panel cohort and request any commissioner with a conflict to recuse themselves through the discussion of each slate of recommended grant awards. The remaining comissioners then deliberate the recommendations in order to reach majority approval of the final grant funding allocation.
- 11. Subsequently, CAH staff will notify awardees and administer grant agreements according to established policies and procedures.

### 33. What efforts has CAH made to increase grant support to Go-Go artists? What grants are available to Go-Go artists?

Eligible Go-Go artists can apply to any grant program for individuals, including the Arts and Humanities Fellowship Program (AHFP), Projects, Events, and Festivals (PEF), and the Sister Cities Grant (SCG).

Within AHFP, we have designated a special cohort exclusively for Go-Go artists. This is now the second year of that cohort, and in both years the number of applications received has been less than ten.

CAH is required by statute to award grants "competitively to individuals and organizations based in and primarily serving the District" (D.C. Official Code § 39-204.(3)). Many individual Go-Go artists, who likely would otherwise be qualified, are not eligible for CAH grant programs because they live outside of the District.

CAH continues to make efforts to support Go-Go artists outside of traditional grant funding, such as through event sponsorships. CAH is also involved in ongoing work with Howard University in developing a partnership around folk/traditional arts support and programming, a key component of which is Go-Go, with funding from the National Endowment for the Arts.

## 34. What efforts has your agency made in the past year to increase transparency? Explain.

CAH continues to livestream the regular monthly meetings and any special meetings of the Commission to YouTube, as a way to increase transparency and accessibility for constituents. We have also presented several "teletownhalls" over the past year. These online, virtual townhalls provide an opportunity for us to communicate news and updates, as well as answer questions and receive feedback from our stakeholders.

Over the past year, CAH developed a new three-year strategic plan for the agency, as well as an update to our Public Art Master Plan. The process for developing both documents involved extensive community engagement through surveys, interviews, and focus groups. Drafts of both plans were published online for public comment before finalizing the documents.

### 35. What efforts will your agency be making to increase transparency? Explain.

Commission meetings will continue to be livestreamed to be more accessible and transparent. The agency is currently in the process of revising and updating grant application guidelines. As part of this process, CAH will engage with stakeholders to receive suggestions and feedback on how to make these documents more accessible, understandable, and actionable.

## (b) What KPIs have been dropped (or changed) since 2020? List each specifically and explain why it was dropped or changed.

The KPI "per capita spending on the arts in the District" was dropped because CAH's annual budget is funded by a dedicated percent of sales tax revenues received. Furthermore, CAH's annual budget allocations are legislatively mandated and cannot be changed by the agency. Therefore, this KPI does not measure the agency's performance as the result cannot be controlled or affected by the agency

The KPI "number of subsidized days provided to the community at the Lincoln Theatre" was dropped because the number of subsidized days provided for the community was previously established per the terms of the Lincoln Theatre lease agreement, making this KPI largely irrelevant as a measure of the agency's performance.

42. What are your top five priorities for the agency? Please provide a detailed explanation for how the agency expects to achieve or work toward these priorities in fiscal years 2021 and 2022.

## 1. Exploring opportunities for affordable living/workspace for artists and BIPOC-led organizations

The availability of affordable living, studio, rehearsal, and performance spaces in the city continues to be of significant concern to many artists and humanities practitioners. In the past four years, CAH has continued its commitment to supporting individual practitioners by increasing both the number and size of general operating awards (Art and Humanities Fellowship Program) to them and through relief and recovery program grants. The agency has also built out its Facilities and Buildings (FAB) program to support organizations as they purchase and renovate space. More recently, in FY 2021, the FAB grant was expanded to offer mortgage and rent relief to organizations. The application window for a second year of relief programming closes on March 4<sup>th</sup>.

CAH is keen to establish an even more significant footprint for arts and humanities organizations and individuals in the city and has begun exploring the possibility of creating a collective impact initiative around space for organizations that have been traditionally marginalized and/or under-resourced in the area of property ownership. CAH plans to work with sister agencies, including DMPED and OCP, to identify opportunities and collaborate on similar initiatives in place at those agencies. CAH also plans to engage the community in an authentic way to assess needs and to best craft a collective impact initiative to meet those identified needs.

2. Integration of Inclusion, Diversity, Equity and Access Values and Practices
In June 2020, former Chairperson Kay Kendall and Commissioner Cora Masters Barry
formed the Task Force for Equity and Belonging. CAH commissioners, staff and
community members engaged in a six-month discussion facilitated by current
Chairperson Reggie Van Lee to examine Inclusion, Diversity, Equity and Access
(I.D.E.A.) values and their incorporation in CAH's grant making practices.

A total of 45 recommendations spanning multiple agency departments was presented by the Task Force and adopted by the Board of Commissioners at the January 2021 regular meeting. CAH's three-year Strategic Plan and Public Art Master Plan updates were also completed within that period and included most of these recommendations in their scope. The recommendations are a mix of internal and external strategies, intended to improve or increase equitable practices in CAH's grantmaking as well as encouraging our grantees to improve or increase diversity, equity and inclusion practices within their organizations. CAH is currently engaged in implementation of these recommendations. We made immediate progress on some actionable goals. Other goals are in process, and still others are iterative and require benchmarking and data. In consultation with Commissioners and the arts and humanities communities, CAH will continue to implement existing recommendations and look to incorporate others that strengthen our intent to remove barriers, improve communications and outreach, and support access to CAH grant programs. By creating a framework that embeds I.D.E.A. values in our grant making, we

aim to amplify the gains through the work of our grantees and ultimately create the kind of collective impact that will ensure resilience and solvency for the District's arts and culture ecosystem.

### 3. Aiding in post-pandemic recovery of the District's Arts and Culture sector

Economic studies and reports indicate that cultural and creative sectors locally, nationally and globally are among the hardest hit by the COVID-pandemic and its multiple aftershocks. Creative workers have experienced unemployment, organizations have lost revenue streams and income and job losses for nonprofit arts organizations is three times worse than the average for all nonprofits. Despite current advances in vaccine availability and mass inoculation, full operations and mass gatherings have yet to regain levels considered normal before the pandemic. All this points to the critical role CAH must play in providing relief funding and further bolstering the strength and capacity of arts and humanities organizations and practitioners to survive, adjust and ultimately, thrive.

Given the District's diverse creative ecosystem, which includes a broad range of artistic disciplines, organizational budget sizes, and geographic location, we need to understand the unique impact the pandemic has had on specific neighborhoods, art forms, employment types and communities. From fiscal year 2020 to date, CAH has taken steps to extend support to individual artists and organizations through relief and recovery grants, removing matching dollar requirements, adjusting grant scopes and timelines and creating rent and mortgage relief opportunities. In addition, in January 2022, CAH commissioned a research study to assess the economic impact of COVID-19 on the District's arts and cultural sector which will be completed in summer 2022. This study and the recommended strategies on aiding in the recovery of the sector will provide data-driven research to inform our grantmaking and best ensure the sector's resilience and solvency into the future. The study will also contribute to similar efforts to collect data and inform policy by local, state, jurisdictional and national bodies such as DMPED and Americans for the Arts.

### 4. Arts and Humanities Nonprofits Organizational Capacity Building

CAH is committed to stabilizing and strengthening organizations, so they are able to continue to provide excellent services and programming to District residents and visitors. As part of this commitment, CAH has launched a pilot capacity building initiative around identified areas of organizational priority/need. During the latter half of FY 2022, ninety (90) organizations will work together in small "communities of practice" with industry experts to gain knowledge and skills in these identified areas. Areas include: Creating an organizational access and inclusion plan; Building an organizational framework for I.D.E.A.; and Developing a marketing strategies plan for performing arts organizations. The work done in this pilot initiative will help guide CAH staff in developing a new capacity building project-grant program to launch in FY 2023.

CAH continues to offer capacity building support to individual artists and humanities practitioners through its Business of the Arts and CAH in the Community programs, along with professional development opportunities for artists working with children and

youth in its arts education program.

### 5. Cultural Plan Steering Committee


When the DC Cultural Plan was released in March 2019, certain elements of the Plan were not well-received by the arts and cultural sector. Shortly thereafter, CAH began the transition to an independent agency, which was followed by the pandemic and resultant state of emergency, all of which hindered any additional action regarding implementation of the Plan.

The Cultural Plan for the District Act of 2015 mandates that a Cultural Plan Steering Committee be formed to assist in the implementation of the Plan. CAH has begun the process of engaging with the various stakeholders named in the legislation to be a part of this Steering Committee with the hope of beginning regular quarterly meetings as soon as possible.

The DC Cultural Plan is extensive and multi-faceted, and while some elements of the Plan may not be viable for various reasons, we believe that there are many aspects that have the potential to be of benefit for the sector and the District. Many of the issues covered by the Plan continue to exist, and some have likely been exacerbated over the last two years. The Steering Committee will be able to re-assess the Plan and identify actionable and impactful strategies and recommendations to implement. The Plan could ultimately play a key role in informing the recovery efforts for the District's and cultural sector.
