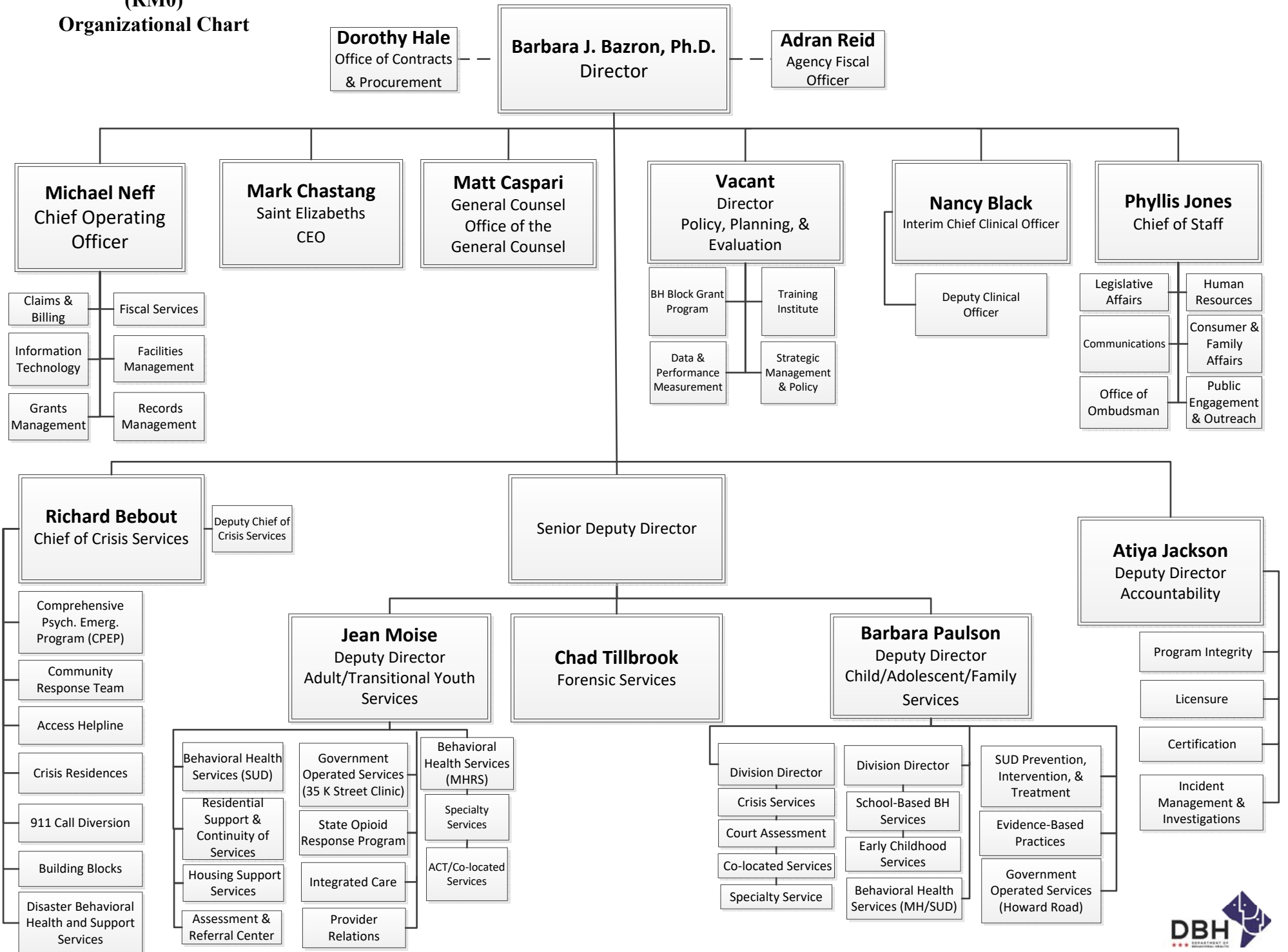

- Participate in International Overdose Awareness Day (August)
- Participate in Drug Take Back Day twice a year (April & October)
- Disseminate literature and materials using information provided by DBH

A few highlights include the following: all 8 faith-based grantees participated in International Overdose Awareness week of August 31 that included guest speakers, naloxone distribution, and street outreach; an initiative to deliver food to a household in Ward 7 by Good Success Church; and distribution of naloxone and opioid education materials by the ministry food pantry. In FY23, 7 awards of \$60,000 have been granted to continue efforts in providing support groups for the community. Wards 5, 6, 7, 8 will be given priority and grantees are required to partner with the community in their respective Wards. Two major goals for FY23 are to have grantees continue being naloxone distribution sites and distribute information to community members.
