13 To posthumously recognize and honor the life and accomplishments of Jacquelyn Renee'  
14 Glover.

16 WHEREAS, Jacquelyn Renee' Glover was born on June 10, 1974 in Albany, New York to  
17 Dr. Lillie Beasley Glover and Major Herman W. Glover Jr;

18 WHEREAS, Jacquelyn Renee' Glover was raised in Orangeburg, South Carolina as a  
19 member of the Williams Chapel AME Church and an affiliate of Evening Light Church of God in  
20 Laurens, SC.;

21 WHEREAS, Jacquelyn Renee' Glover completed her secondary education at Wilkinson  
22 High School in Orangeburg, SC, and at North Carolina A&T State University in Greensboro, North  
23 Carolina where she earned a Bachelors of Science in Architectural Engineering;

24 WHEREAS, Jacquelyn Renee' Glover completed her post-secondary education at John  
25 Hopkins University in Baltimore, Maryland with a Business Leadership Development Certificate  
26 and The Catholic University of America in Washington D.C. with a Master of Science degree in  
27 Engineering/Construction Engineering Management;

28 WHEREAS, Jacquelyn Renee' Glover spent 26 years working on her passion in various  
29 architectural and engineering projects throughout the District of Columbia and surrounding area;

30 WHEREAS, Jacquelyn Renee' Glover held roles within the construction industry that  
31 included principal (CEO), partner, managing director, project manager, senior facilities engineer,  
32 as well as architectural engineering coordinator for private and public sector clients;

33 WHEREAS, in her career Jacquelyn Renee' Glover ended her time as the Vice President  
34 of Business Development, Delon Hampton Associates, Chartered;

35 WHEREAS, Jacquelyn Renee' Glover had a passion for developing leaders in her field  
36 and helping others within the construction industry grow;

37 WHEREAS, Jacquelyn Renee' Glover was an advocate for inclusion and equity for women  
38 and Black professionals within the engineering, architecture and infrastructure industries; and

39           WHEREAS, Jacquelyn Renee’ Glover leaves behind a legacy of compassion for her family  
40 and for pursuing her passion of engineering and business leadership development.

41           RESOLVED, BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this  
42 resolution may be cited as the “Jacquelyn Renee’ Glover Posthumous Ceremonial Resolution of  
43 2023”.
