22	Reform Temporary Amendment Act of 2022, effective August 12, 2022 (D.C. Law 24-149; 69
23	DCR 11395) ("temporary law"). The temporary law expired on March 25, 2023.
24	(b) On December 20, 2022, the Council passed the Comprehensive Policing and Justice
25	Reform Amendment Act of 2022, effective April 21, 2023 (D.C. Law 24-354; DCR)
26	("permanent law").
27	(c) On March 7, 2023, the Council passed the Comprehensive Policing and Justice
28	Reform Emergency Amendment Act of 2023, effective March 24, 2023 (D.C. Act 25-61; 70
29	DCR 3820) ("emergency act"). The emergency act prevented a gap in the law between the
30	expiration of the temporary act and the effective date of the permanent law.

31 (d) While most of the permanent law went into effect on April 21, 2023, section 105 of
32 the permanent law was passed subject-to-appropriations and will not take effect until it has been
33 funded.

- (e) This final round of emergency and temporary legislation is now necessary to prevent a
  gap in the law between the expiration of the emergency law and the applicability date of section
  105 of the permanent legislation.
