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25	Sec. 2. (a) An unprecedented influx of migrants, totaling approximately 10,373
26	individuals, have arrived in Washington, DC from Texas and Arizona on over 290 buses since
20	individuals, have arrived in washington, De from Texas and Arizona on over 290 buses since
27	October 6, 2022, with an additional 8,000 migrants arriving on over 300 buses prior to April 13,
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28	2022.
29	(b) The challenges faced by these migrants necessitate continued attention and
30	comprehensive support that extends beyond the capabilities of our esteemed non-Governmental

31	Organizations (NGO) partners alone, which have expressed limitations in terms of staffing,
27	resources and logistics
32	resources, and logistics.

33 (c) To address these needs, the Council enacted the Migrant Services and Supports
 34 Temporary Act of 2022 on October 4, 2022, which will expire on August 3rd, 2023 without
 35 further Council action.

36 (d) The Office of Migrant Services (OMS) continues to provide a range of vital services
37 to support migrants and any abrupt discontinuation of these services will lead to significant harm
38 to migrants and District residents.

(e) The Council clarified the eligibility, procedural protections, and support services for
migrants in the Migrant Services Eligibility Clarification Temporary Amendment Act of 2023,
passed on second reading on May 2, 2023.

42 (f) Even with this legislation and dedicated resources, the scale of this challenge requires
43 collective action and shared responsibility, including active participation by the federal
44 government in addressing the needs of migrants.

(g) The provisions of the Migrant Services and Supports Temporary Act of 2022 and Migrant Services Clarification Temporary Amendment Act of 2023 must be extended without delay to continue to provide necessary assistance and aid to migrants who have been forced to seek refuge within our borders, while concurrently preserving the programs and resources essential for the welfare of existing District residents.

50 Sec. 3. The Council of the District of Columbia determines that the circumstances 51 enumerated in section 2 constitute emergency circumstances making it necessary that the 52 Migrant Services and Supports Extension Emergency Amendment Act of 2023 should be 53 adopted after a single reading.

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Sec. 4. This resolution shall take effect immediately.

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
