22	TITLE I. MIGRANT SERVICES AND SUPPORTS					
23	Sec. 101. Migrant services and supports.					
24	The Mayor may establish an office and administer programs to provide time-limited					
25	services and supports to recent immigrants to the United States, including the following services					
26	and supports:					
27	(1) Welcome and other reception services;					
28	(2) Food, clothing, baby supplies including formula, if baby formula is reasonably					
29	available for purchase in the District and other necessities;					
30	(3) Temporary shelter which:					
31	(A) May be provided in a congregate setting; provided, that families with					
32	minor children shall be prioritized to be housed in non-congregate shelter units; and					

33	(B) Is maintained in safe, clean, and sanitary condition that meets all					
34	applicable District health, sanitation, fire, building, and zoning codes for residential dwellings.					
35	(4) Medical services, including health insurance;					
36	(5) Relocation services; including:					
37	(A) Services associated with traveling to a secondary destination outside					
38	of the District; and					
39	(B) Services associated with settling recent immigrants in the District					
40	when a person intends to make the District their permanent home.					
41	(6) Cash assistance for food and other necessities, transportation, relocation, and

43	(7) Social and legal services and referrals to external social and legal service

45	Sec. 102. Eligibility.					
46	(a) The Mayor shall establish and publish eligibility and termination criteria for services					
47	and supports funded pursuant to this Act within 30 days after the effective date of the Migrant					
48	Services Eligibility Clarification Emergency Amendment Act of 2023, enacted April 24, 2023					
49	(D.C. Act 25-69; 70 DCR 6115); provided, that the eligibility and termination criteria:					
50	(1) May include statutory, regulatory, or programmatic categories of immigration,					
51	means of entering the District, and length of time in the United States or the District;					
52	(2) Shall ensure that individuals are provided with adequate written and oral					
53	notice in the individual's requested language when services are denied or terminated pursuant to

99	immigration proceedings, including any appeals."				

	(b) Section $7(c)(3)(B)$) (D.C. Official Co	ode § 4-753.01(c)	(3)(B)) is amende	ed to read as

"(B) The Mayor shall determine that a person seeking shelter by reason of domestic violence, sexual assault, human trafficking, refugee status, or asylum, is a resident of the District without receiving demonstration of District residency in accordance with section 2(32) of this act, except if the Mayor can demonstrate that a person seeking asylum is eligible for and will receive shelter under Title I of the Migrant Services and Supports Temporary Amendment Act of 2022, effective December 21, 2022 (D.C. Law 24-234; DC Official Code § 4-773.01 *et seq.*), or any subsequently enacted act substantially similar to Title I, the Mayor may direct that person to the Office of Migrant Services to obtain shelter."
