A BILL

IN THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA

To amend, on a temporary basis, the Legalization of Marijuana for Medical Treatment Initiative of 1999 to provide that the five cultivation center registration applicants that scored 150 points or more after submitting a medical cannabis facility registration application to the Alcoholic Beverage and Cannabis Board during the open application period that occurred between November 29, 2021 and March 28, 2022 shall be considered for a manufacturer license.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this act may be cited as the “Medical Cannabis Manufacturer Clarification Temporary Amendment Act of 2023”.

Sec. 2. Section 7 of the Legalization of Marijuana for Medical Treatment Initiative of 1999, effective February 25, 2010 (D.C. Law 13-315; D.C. Official Code § 7-1671.06), is amended as follows:

(a) A new subsection (y) is added to read as follows:

“(y)(1) The five cultivation center registration applicants that submitted a medical cannabis facility registration application to the ABC Board between November 29, 2021 and March 28, 2022, that scored 150 points or more shall be considered by the ABC Board for a manufacturer license after the effective date of the act; provided that the applicant files a manufacturer license application with the Board by May 1, 2024.

41 (a) This act shall take effect following approval by the Mayor (or in the event of veto by
42 the Mayor, action by the Council to override the veto), a 30-day period of congressional review
43 as provided in section 602(c)(1) of the District of Columbia Home Rule Act, approved December
44 24, 1973 (87 Stat. 813; D.C. Official Code § 1-206.02(c)(1), and publication in the District of
45 Columbia register.

46 (b) This act shall expire after 225 days of its having taken effect.
