16	To recognize and honor the month of October as Housing Cooperative Month and to highlight
17	the importance of cooperatives within the District's housing ecosystem.

19	WHEREAS, the United States has recognized October as National Co-op Month since
20	1964;
21	WHEREAS, the 6 fundamental values of cooperatives are self-help, self-responsibility,
22	democracy, equality, equity, and solidarity;
4	democracy, equality, equity, and solidarity,
23	WHEREAS, the 7 cooperative principles are voluntary and open membership;
24	democratic member control; members' economic participation; autonomy and independence;
25	education, training, and information; cooperation among cooperatives; and concern for
	education, training, and information, ecoperation among ecoperatives, and concern for
26	community;
27	WHEREAS, a housing cooperative is a collectively owned and managed entity that
28	provides an opportunity for homeownership and the development of long-term, sustainable
20	provides an opportunity for nomeownership and the development of long term, sustainable
29	communities;

30	WHEREAS, housing cooperatives operate democratically with a member-elected board,
31	providing co-op residents with more input in the operation of their building;

32	WHEREAS, housing cooperatives preserve and propagate affordability for low-

33	and moderate-income individuals and families, combatting the affordable housing dilemma
34	while simultaneously catalyzing the social and economic growth of residents;
35	WHEREAS, the District of Columbia has been dedicated to establishing housing
36	cooperatives since 1920 and has cherished their vital importance to the city's history, fabric, and
37	landscape;
38	WHEREAS, the District has supported the creation of limited equity housing cooperatives
39	since 1979 and currently has over 4,300 limited equity cooperative units across approximately 100
40	buildings;
41	WHEREAS, the District of Columbia Limited Equity Cooperative Task Force
42	issued a report on limited equity cooperatives in October 2019, followed by a study
43	completed in February 2020 by the Coalition for Nonprofit Housing and Economic
44	Development, to deepen the District's understanding of cooperatives in its existing housing
45	landscape.
46	RESOLVED, BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this
47	resolution may be cited as the "Housing Cooperative Month Recognition Resolution of 2023".
48	Sec. 2. The Council of the District of Columbia recognizes and highlights the
49	significance of housing cooperatives throughout the District and declares October as "Housing
50	Cooperative Month" in the District of Columbia.
51	Sec. 3. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon the first date of publication in
52	the District of Columbia Register.
