WHEREAS, Sam Ford is a founding member of the National Association of Black Journalists;

WHEREAS, Sam Ford has won numerous industry awards including the New York, Edward R Murrow and several regional Emmy's;

WHEREAS, Sam Ford has served the residents of the District of Columbia with his journalism keeping them informed on their home throughout his career;

WHEREAS, Sam Ford is an active member of Ebenezer United Methodist Church in Capitol Hill where he serves as a lay leader and occasional organist;

WHEREAS, Sam Ford has been key figure of covering the news of the District of Columbia government for over 35 years;
