16	Sec. 2. The Rental Housing Act of 1985, effective July 17, 1985 (D.C. Law 6-10; D.C.
17	Official Code § 42-3501.01 et seq.)), is amended by adding a new section 215a to read as

19	"Sec. 215a. (a) Notwithstanding the requirements of section 215, tenants and housing
20	providers shall not enter into a voluntary agreement pursuant to section 215(a) for 1 year.
21	"(b) Subsection (a) of this section shall not affect any voluntary agreements that have
22	already been approved by the Rent Administrator pursuant to section 215(b) prior to the
23	applicability date of the Voluntary Agreement Moratorium Amendment Act of 2020, passed on
24	2nd reading December 15, 2020 (enrolled version of Bill 23-878).".
25	Sec. 3. Applicability.
26	This act shall apply as of October 1, 2023.
27	Sec. 4. Fiscal impact statement.

24, 1973 (87 Stat. 813; D.C. Official Code § 1-206.02(c)(1)), and publication in the District of
Columbia Register.
