On Thursday, October 19, 2023, Councilmember Anita Bonds will hold a public roundtable to discuss the District of Columbia's Job Training Programs.

The District government supports residents looking to begin and advance in meaningful careers through a multitude of job training programs, including apprenticeships, on-the-job training, vocational/skill training, and subsidized employment opportunities for youth. These job training programs are largely organized by the District's lead labor agencies – the Department of Employment Services (DOES), the Workforce Investment Council (WIC), and the Department of Human Resources (DCHR) – with cross-sector coordination and support provided by the Deputy Mayor for Education (DME).

Collaboration between these lead labor agencies and our education system is a key component of our workforce development system, and it is critically important that these programs both provide residents with the tools necessary to forge successful careers while connecting them with stable employment. This roundtable will give the Committee the opportunity to examine programming within DOES, the WIC, DCHR, and DME and discuss their collective progress toward establishing a high-quality portfolio of job training services that improves employment outcomes for residents in the District.
