On Thursday, November 9, 2023, Councilmember Anita Bonds will hold a public roundtable to discuss the District's First Source Program and Alternative Workforce Plans. The Committee will hear from government and public witnesses. The purpose of this roundtable is to examine the First Source Program.

The First Source Program, administered by the Department of Employment Services (DOES), has been an important part of the District of Columbia's strategy to reduce unemployment in the city since 1984. First Source ensures that city residents are given priority for new jobs created by municipal financing and development programs. The aim of the First Source program is to provide District residents with the ability to build careers and earn a living wage. In 2011, the Council passed a bill with substantial changes to the First Source law, including eliminating contracts under \$300K from First Source obligations and requiring that 51% of all new hires on any government-assisted project or contract between \$300,000 and \$5,000,000 must be District residents.

When a contractor believes that they are unable to meet the 51% requirement during the course of a project or contract, they are able to obtain an Alternative Workforce Plan to allow them to fulfill staffing needs without hiring 51% or more of District residents. Is this process justifiable? This roundtable will examine these plans and how they are used.

Testimony will be limited to 5 minutes for witnesses testifying on behalf of an organization, and 3 minutes for witnesses testifying as members of the public.

If someone is unable to testify at the public hearing, written statements are encouraged and will be made a part of the official record. Written statements should be submitted to through the Council's Hearing Management System <a href="https://lims.dccouncil.gov/hearings">https://lims.dccouncil.gov/hearings</a>. The record will close at 5:00 p.m. on Monday, November 20, 2023.
