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20	BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, that this
21	act may be cited as the "School Improvement Emergency Amendment Act of 2023".
22	Sec. 2. Section 3 of the State Education Office Establishment Act of 2000, effective
23	October 21, 2000 (D.C. Law 13-176; D.C Official Code § 38-2602), is amended by adding a new
24	subsection (d) to read as follows:
25	"(d)(1) OSSE shall establish a School Support Office ("Office") to implement and
26	administer a school support Program ("Program") beginning in School Year 2025-2026. The
27	Program shall provide support and resources for continuous academic improvement to DCPS
28	schools and District public charter schools whose academic performance is, at minimum, the
29	lowest 5% of all public schools in the District.
30	"(2) It shall be the goal of the Program to substantially improve academic
31	outcomes within 5 years of a school entering the Program. Subject to appropriations, the Office

32	shall provide local funding, in addition to any Formula or federal funding already available to
33	low performing schools, to qualifying schools that participate in the Program.
34	"(3) No later than September 30, 2024, OSSE shall submit a report to the Mayor
35	and the Council, developed in consultation with the State Board of Education, DCPS, the District
36	of Columbia Public Charter School Board, and other stakeholders, which shall:
37	"(A) Compare and assess school improvement best practices from other
38	jurisdictions;
39	"(B) Identify and explain the metrics that will be used to determine the
40	schools whose academic performance is, at minimum, the lowest 5% of all public schools in the
41	District.
42	"(C) Propose evidence-based strategies for continuous school
43	improvement models for the lowest performing 5% of District public schools, including:
44	(i) The processes and frameworks for implementing the models;
45	(ii) How each strategy or model will address professional
46	development for educators, direct coaching, and leadership focused on addressing instructional
47	practice; and
48	(iii) How utilization of the models and Office funding will align
49	with PCSB and DCPS accountability metrics and frameworks;
50	"(D) Provide recommendations for how the Office will work
51	collaboratively with qualifying schools and school stakeholders to select and implement
52	evidence-based strategies to significantly increase proficiency and growth in reading and math
53	through proven methods and improve other school designation metrics;

54	"(E) Provide recommendations on how the Office may strengthen a
55	designated school's finances, financial management, policies, and culture;
56	"(F) Describe how a participating school's improvement will be evaluated,
57	including the criteria for exiting the Program;
58	"(G) Explain how the Program will adjust to address a school that has not
59	demonstrated sufficient improvement to exit the program after 5 years;
60	"(H) Explain the funding and resources needed to successfully establish
61	and operate the Office and implement the Program for participating schools;
62	"(I) Set forth what additional authority OSSE will need, if any, to
63	implement the report's recommendations and establish the Office and Program; and
64	"(J) Discuss any additional items relevant to the needs of the Office or
65	Program.
66	"(4) No later than September 1, 2025, and subject to appropriation, OSSE shall
67	apply the school improvement models developed by the school support office to participating
68	schools.
69	"(5) Starting September 30, 2026, and every 2 years thereafter, OSSE shall submit
70	a report to the Mayor and the Council on the improvement of schools in the Program. The report
71	shall address the effectiveness of the continuous school improvement models and provide
72	recommendations, if any, for program improvement, including a description of evidence-based
73	strategies developed or further refined in the years since the last report.

Effective date. 79 This act shall take effect following approval by the Mayor (or in the event of veto by the 80 Mayor, action by the Council to override the veto), and shall remain in effect for no longer than 81 90 days, as provided for emergency acts of the Council of the District of Columbia in section 82 412(a) of the District of Columbia Home Rule Act, approved December 24, 1973 (87 Stat. 788; 83 D.C. Official Code § 1-204.12(a)).
