

15 To amend, on a temporary basis, the Public Safety Grants Amendment Act of 2023 to clarify that
16 the TRIGGER Project is the intended recipient of a budgeted grant to support its work on
17 gun violence prevention.

19 BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this
20 act may be cited as the “Violence Prevention Grant Clarification Temporary Amendment Act of
21 2024”.

22 Sec. 2. Section 3024(a) of the Public Safety Grants Amendment Act of 2023, effective
23 September 6, 2023 (D.C. Law 25-50; 70 DCR 10366), is amended to read as follows:

24 “(a) Notwithstanding the Grant Administration Act of 2013, effective December 24, 2013
25 (D.C. Law 20-61; D.C. Official Code § 1-328.11 *et seq.*), no later than April 15, 2024, the Office
26 of Neighborhood Safety and Engagement shall award a grant in the amount of \$150,000 to the
27 TRIGGER Project to support their work on preventing gun violence.”.

28 Sec. 3. Fiscal impact statement.

29 The Council adopts the fiscal impact statement of the Budget Director as the fiscal impact
30 statement required by section 4a of the General Legislative Procedures Act of 1975, approved
31 October 16, 2006 (120 Stat. 2038; D.C. Official Code § 1-301.47a).

32 Sec. 5. Effective date.

33 (a) This act shall take effect following approval by the Mayor (or in the event of veto by
34 the Mayor, action by the Council to override the veto), and a 30-day period of congressional
35 review as provided in section 602(c)(1) of the District of Columbia Home Rule Act, approved
36 December 24, 1973 (87 Stat. 813; D.C. Official Code § 1-206.02(c)(1)).

37 (b) This act shall expire after 225 days of its having taken effect.
