24	Sec. 2. (a) Pursuant to section 404 of the District of Columbia Home Rule Act, approved
25	December 24, 1973 (87 Stat. 787; D.C. Official Code § 1-204.04), and consistent with the Street
26	and Alley Closing and Acquisition Procedures Act of 1982, effective March 10, 1983 (D.C. Law
27	4-201; D.C. Official Code § 9-201.01 et seq.), the Council finds that the portion of public alley in
28	Square 5051, as shown on the Surveyor's plat filed under S.O. 21-00136, is unnecessary for alley
29	purposes and orders it closed with title to the land to vest as shown on the Surveyor's plat.
30	(b) The ordering of this alley closing is contingent upon the property owner receiving the
31	requisite public space approvals for parking and loading access prior to the recordation of the
32	plat by the Surveyor.
