On Thursday, September 19, 2024, Councilmember Brianne K. Nadeau, Chairperson of the Committee on Public Works and Operations, will convene a public roundtable to consider Proposed Resolution 25-0794, the “Director of the Department of For-Hire Vehicles Jonathan M. Rogers Confirmation Resolution of 2024,” and Proposed Resolution 25-0920, the “Chief Technology Officer Stephen Miller Confirmation Resolution of 2024.” The roundtable will begin at 11:00 a.m.

Proposed Resolution 25-0794, the “Director of the Department of For-Hire Vehicles Jonathan M. Rogers Confirmation Resolution of 2024,” would confirm the appointment of Acting Director Jonathan Rogers as Director of the Department of For-Hire Vehicles.

Proposed Resolution 25-0920, the “Chief Technology Officer Stephen Miller Confirmation Resolution of 2024” would confirm the appointment of Stephen Miller as Chief Technology Officer of the Office of the Chief Technology Officer.

The roundtable will have a hybrid format, with the government appearing in person, and public witnesses appearing in-person or virtually via the Zoom platform. Those who wish to testify must

Representatives of organizations will be allowed a maximum of five minutes for oral testimony, and individuals (and any subsequent representatives of the same organizations) will be allowed a maximum of three minutes. Witnesses who anticipate needing spoken language interpretation, or require sign language interpretation, are requested to inform the Committee office of the need as soon as possible but no later than five business days before the proceeding by emailing [publicworks@dccouncil.gov](mailto:publicworks@dccouncil.gov). We will make every effort to fulfill timely requests. Witnesses will receive instructions on how to participate by Zoom prior to the roundtable.
