DC PCSB’s special purpose revenue fund is our agency’s main operations fund. Funds are is derived from an administrative fee of up to one percent of each public charter school’s annual total revenues (including federal and other revenue sources) minus several exclusions: philanthropic revenues, investments, dividends, interest, net rental income, and net gain on sales of assets other than inventory, loan forgiveness from the Paycheck Protection Program (PPP), Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief (ESSER) funds, Employee Retention Tax Credit received under the CARES Act or ARP Act, OSSE grants for COVID-19 testing, school-based clinical support, and contact tracing, OSSE Public Charter School Reopening Facilities Grant , and Federal Communication Commission’s Emergency Connectivity Fund under its mandated chartering authority. We are happy to provide details on any individual transaction as needed.

This MOU provided funds to make executive coaching available to public charter school and system leaders as well as their leadership teams. - DCHR Background Check MOU FY 2024: Entered January 8, 2024. Expires September 30, 2024. Under this MOU DCHR performs background checks on the employees of public charter schools. (Attached Q15 G)

There is one pending lawsuit against the agency brought by a parent who alleges her child with a disability was not provided a free appropriate public education under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act by a public charter school (*Crawford v. District of Columbia Public Charter School Board*).

There was one such lawsuit against the agency in FY 2023 and FY 2024 to date. The plaintiff identified in Q16 previously filed an identical lawsuit against DC PCSB in July 2023 (*Mia Crawford v. D.C. Public Charter School Board et al. Case No.: 2023-CAB-004367*). She subsequently amended the complaint to name the Office of the State Superintendent of Education as the defendant, removing DC PCSB as a party, and the lawsuit was ultimately dismissed in November 2023. In December 2023, the plaintiff then filed the lawsuit identified in Q16 against DC PCSB, which is still pending.

23. What efforts has your agency made in the past year to increase transparency in FY 2024 that differs from past efforts? Explain.

DC PCSB will roll out the proposed ASPIRE system in FY 2024. We created a webpage in February 2024 to better explain how we intend to evaluate schools. It is important to the agency that the public understand how we plan

to evaluate schools moving forward and the implementation timeline. To do this, we created a web page in February 2024 dedicated to ASPIRE. The link to this page on our website is easily accessible from our homepage, www.dcpcsb.org. This section of our website includes videos which explain what an accountability system is, why the move to ASPIRE is important and timely, and how ASPIRE will differ from the Performance Management Framework, our previous system. The public can also read materials and view an infographic that provides detailed information about aspects of ASPIRE, and those materials are also available in Spanish and Amharic.

We also continue to seek to improve the ease of navigating our website. One change we are making is to have dedicated pages that link to multiple years of like-materials in one place. For example, if someone wanted to look through multiple years of a school's annual reports, they could open one document which would link to the current year's annual report as well as previous year's annual reports. This is an ongoing project.

(a) Please identify any legislative requirements that your agency lacks sufficient resources to properly implement.

DC PCSB manages the lead testing program (DC Code 38-825.01a) for all public charter schools in the District. Each year we hire a contractor to replace filters on drinking water sources and sample and test more than 3,200 water sources for lead. If a source has high lead levels, it is taken out of service and remediated. That may include changing the filter and retesting. Results of lead testing are shared with schools and posted on our website.

When the Council codified lead testing requirements in 2017, it only funded the DCPS portion of the bill. DC PCSB has continued to fund this vital program out of a combination of local funds grants and reallocations since. Prior to the one year of ARPA funding, funds received for these purposes were \$1.7M in FY17 (checks of \$1M and \$0.7M from DME) and \$600k in FY19 from the City Administrator. In addition, we received a federal grant for \$144,000 for each of 2 years (FY 2020 & FY 2021) through DOEE. In FY 2022 and FY 2023, DC PCSB received \$1,167,675.43 in grant funding from the DC Department of the Energy and the Environment (DOEE) for lead in water testing and filter replacement. DC PCSB has not received funding for FY 2024.

Thus, it will be forced to cover the \$997,149.50 of associated costs to protect the safety of students and staff at public charter schools.

In FY 2022, through ARPA funding, the subject to appropriations language for public charter schools was repealed. Last year the ARPA funding was removed from the budget, leaving DC PCSB solely responsible for the annual cost of the program. Public charter schools or DC PCSB require an additional funding stream of roughly \$1 million (costs fluctuate depending on the prices of filters and services) annually to pay for this service outside the UPSFF.

(b) Please identify any statutory or regulatory impediments to your agency's operations.

We support moving up the date for charter review and renewal applications, which is codified, to better align with the MySchoolDC lottery dates. As of now, the law permits LEAs to submit renewal applications as late as the spring of a given school year. This presents a challenge if rejecting a renewal application before the enrollment deadline for MySchoolDC. Revising the required submission date would allow sufficient due process to occur and provide families more time to prepare if a school closes. This request does not have any financial implications.

Although we have not closed a school in multiple years, and we do not anticipate closing any schools over the next year, we continue to favor adding an optional enrollment preference for students who attend a school that may close. A lottery preference for students leaving a closed school would help DC families who have experienced underperforming schools. While DC PCSB strives to make tough decisions regarding charter revocation before the lottery, we believe this preference would add another layer of access and give the students who need help the most an opportunity to attend another school.

We also support implementing multiple attendance count days. Given that DC has a robust system of choice, there is inevitably some movement between sectors throughout the school year. Multiple count days would help with potential budgeting challenges which result. This change will also support schools which experience student population increases mid-year due to the enrollment of students migrating from other countries.

27. Describe any new partnerships or collaborations currently underway with District government agencies. Indicate any new partnerships or collaborations developed, planned, or implemented during fiscal year 2023 and 2024.

DC PCSB continues to partner and collaborate with city agencies to improve the coordination between city services and public charter schools.

Additionally, we seek to influence the implementation processes and increase the resources available to public charter schools.

Background Check Program

DC PCSB partnered with DC Department of Human Resources (DCHR) to develop a background check program to give school access to the necessary systems to conduct background checks for school staff. DCHR performs criminal background checks as well as sex-offender checks; mobile finger printing services; NASDTEC Educator Clearinghouse Checks; CFSA Child Protection Register Checks; and all other required due diligence under the School Safety Omnibus Amendment Act of 2018, including a comprehensive review of employment history on school staff and applicants at participating schools. Schools sign a service level agreement with DCHR to participate in the program. DC PCSB has a Memorandum of Understanding with DCHR where we pay DCHR for these services in advance and bill schools for services rendered. During school year 2022-23, 21 public charter schools participated in the program. This partnership will end in September 2024, as DCHR has indicated they can no longer support this program. We are working with the DC Charter School Alliance to find alternative vendors and that can support public charter schools.

DC Office of Migrant Services

We are collaborating with the Office of Migrant Services to better understand and be a resource that can support migrant students and families. Most recently, we facilitated a conversation between My School DC and Migrant Services with the goal of helping the team understand the process for to enroll in a public or public charter school.

DCPS Global Education Program and Washington Passport Agency (US Department of State)

We are working with DC Public Schools (DCPS) and the Washington Passport Agency to host a Passport Day in March 2024 for public and public charter school students to use to travel abroad. The Passport Agency will manage the administrative aspect, accepting passport applications during Passport Day.

31. Detail and discuss the Qualitative Site Review (QSR) process for fiscal years 2023 and 2024 (through January 31). How many LEAs were reviewed and what was the PCSB focus?

All DC public charter schools receive a QSR once every five years at minimum, which provides qualitative data in addition to the quantitative data regularly collected. QSRs are conducted at schools the year prior to a charter review or renewal and may also be conducted as a condition of a school's continuance. During the two-week visit, DC PCSB staff and consultants use Charlotte Danielson's Framework for Teaching to evaluate:

- Classroom interactions and culture;
- Instructional time efficiency;
- Student behavior management;
- Lesson clarity and accuracy;
- Questioning and discussion techniques;
- Student engagement;
- Students' awareness of assessment criteria;

- Organizing Physical Space; ‡ and
- Demonstrating Responsiveness and Flexibility. ‡

DC PCSB is piloting domains 2 & 3 (components 2a-2e and 3a-3e) of the 2022 Framework for Teaching (FFT) in eight volunteer schools in SY 2023 – 24 (noted by ‡ in the chart below). DC PCSB is also piloting components 2e, “Organizing Physical Space,” and 3e, “Demonstrating Flexibility and Responsiveness,” of the 2013 FFT in all schools undergoing a QSR in SY 2023 – 24. DC PCSB only reports on observations rated using 2013 FFT for SY 2023 – 24, consistent with previous QSR reporting.

Observations are also conducted to assess the quality of special education (SPED) and emerging multilingual learner (EML) programming. At least one observer trained in special education observes SPED pull-outs, push-in, and inclusion classrooms. A staff member trained in the Sheltered Instruction Observation Protocol (SIOP) observes the instruction of EMLs at any campus enrolling 10 or more EML students.

In SY 2022- 23, we resumed observations for 75% of core content classrooms from the previously set 50% due to the pandemic. Elective classes are observed if they are central to the school’s mission, and substitute teachers are not observed. QSRs also include a student work sample review. In partnership with The New Teacher Project (Tntp), DC PCSB evaluates ten student work samples from all eligible campuses of identified LEAs serving grades K – 12. Each campus is asked to submit a range of assignment types in English language arts (ELA) and math. Each piece of student work is evaluated against a standard rubric designed to answer the question, “Does this task give students the opportunity to meaningfully engage in worthwhile grade-level content?” DC PCSB assigns a score to each work sample in three distinct categories— practice, content, and relevance—before assigning an overall assessment rating. The final QSR report includes a summary of each work sample with justification from the rubric.

DC PCSB hosts debrief meetings with schools that undergo a QSR and provides each campus a written report. During the meetings we discuss what the QSR team observed; provide insights on how the observations rate according to the Framework for Teaching rubric; discuss findings from the EML and SPED observations; and allow schools to ask questions. The reports and meetings support school leaders in identifying strengths and weaknesses.

In SY 2022 – 23, DC PCSB conducted observations at 20 campuses across 13 LEAs. For SY 2023-24 we are scheduled to complete QSRs for 31 campuses across 22 LEAs.

33. What steps did PCSB take in FY23 and FY24 to date to help LEAs to improve practices and policies related to attendance and absenteeism?

Attendance is critical for students’ academic success and is an important measure of student engagement with their school community. DC PCSB’s proposed accountability system, ASPIRE, will measure chronic absenteeism instead of in-seat attendance, a measure included in the Performance Management Framework (PMF). In-seat attendance often masks high rates of chronic absenteeism in schools. DC PCSB is proposing the change to show a school’s success or lack thereof more accurately in engaging students to come to school. Beginning in SY25-26, DC PCSB will publicly assign points for

chronic absenteeism as part of the School Climate portion of ASPIRE, the proposed accountability system.

Also, DC PCSB chose attendance as one of the topics for a Professional Learning Community (PLC). In September 2023, 118 public charter LEA staff registered to attend the session to discuss successes and challenges with attendance and KIPP's Proving Ground Pilot to improve their attendance. The meeting was an opportunity for attendees to collectively problem solve, share best practices, and learn from an LEA doing innovative work.

- 35. Describe how PCSB, through its role on the Coordinating Council on School Behavioral Health, is working to support the expansion of school-based behavioral health services in public charter schools.**

Also provide any barriers or charter LEAs' concerns with regard to the expansion.

DC PCSB continues to work with the Coordinating Council on School Mental Health in collaboration with DBH, OSSE, and DMHHS. We facilitate with connecting public charter schools with Community Based Organizations (CBOs) behavioral health providers. There are currently 101 campuses matched with a CBO and four public charter school campuses who would like to receive behavioral health services. Of the 101 campuses that have been matched with a CBO, there are currently 38 open positions.

DBH Clinical Specialists are also assigned to provide prevention and early intervention services and support for students in schools where CBOs have not been assigned. Clinical Specialists provide small group and whole classroom supports, parent consultations/workshops, and teacher consultations/workshops. The DBH Clinical Specialist screens students who need treatment and refers them to the DBH Parent Infant Early Childhood Enhancement (PIECE) Program where the student and their family can receive evidenced based treatment services. To date, there are 14 campuses with a DBH clinician. Many campuses also hire their own behavioral health staff which includes counselors, occupational and physical therapists, social workers, speech therapists, and psychologists among others.

Public charter LEA have concerns about the facility limitations that do not allow for dedicated spaces for clinicians to meet and provide services to students and the number of CBO vacancies that do not allow schools to meet student mental health needs. We look forward to continued emphasis on recruitment and retention as staffing vacancies continue to hinder services.

36. List all public charter schools for which PCSB conducted special education audits in School Years 2022-2023 and 2023-2024 (through January 31). Include the reason why PCSB conducted the audit and the outcome of the audit.

DC PCSB staff may conduct a desk audit, which is a secondary review of relevant information, if the school meets one or more criteria. The school will be asked to provide specific documentation, as well as written rationale for the data or practice. Based on the information reviewed, DC PCSB will write to close the audit with required OSSE provided technical assistance or training, internal process recommendations, or to pursue further action, including an on-site audit, staff to staff meeting, or a Board response. Staff will continue to monitor a school after an audit is closed and will request progress updates within six months. Past audit results will be considered in determining future procedures.

37. In what ways does DC PCSB support schools to improve their capacity to support emerging multilingual learners?

DC PCSB encourages schools' improvement by bringing professional learning communities (PLCs) together. School leaders and educators come together and share best practices. DC PCSB holds four sessions every year for each community focused on SPED, EML, and School Support and Operations (SSO). Through best practice sharing, discussions, panels, and equitable

design thinking, PLC members approach a variety of topics for greater academic outcomes for EMLs, including:

- Promoting Academic Language Use;
- Implementing Co-teaching Strategies and Push-in Supports;
- Designing and Evaluating Academic Interventions; and
- Supporting Dually-Identified Students.

The development of the professional learning communities comes from school-based EML leaders who reported the need for a collaborative space where they could develop productive connections with other like-role professionals in service of improving the experience of multilingual learners in their schools and sector wide.

DC PCSB also monitors the progress of multilingual learners through the Emerging Multilingual Learner Audit and Monitoring Policy, last updated in September 2023. The policy gives DC PCSB the authority to conduct EML audits of a public charter school at any time and for any reason to ensure the school is compliant with the requirements of the law and its charter regarding the provision of services to EML students. Based on the audit findings DC PCSB may: make recommendations to review and revise internal processes; DC PCSB staff meet with school staff; require OSSE technical assistance; DC PCSB Board Members meet with key staff and members of the school's board; and/or issue a Notice of Concern.

DC PCSB staff also provides feedback on EML instruction during Qualitative Site Reviews. Emerging multilingual learner outcomes are part of the charter review and renewal reports to hold schools accountable to serving all learners.

38. Provide a report on the Mystery Caller Policy and program. Please describe any noncompliance identified by the program in School Years 2022-2023 and 2023-2024 (through January 31). How PCSB worked to remedy any identified noncompliance.

The Mystery Caller initiative rolled into DC PCSB's Open Enrollment Policy to ensure schools are adhering to open enrollment regulations and not discriminating against students with disabilities and/or English learners during the enrollment application process. In the Mystery Caller process, DC PCSB staff and consultants contact a school assuming the role of a parent, guardian, or advocate of a student with a disability or an EML and ask multiple questions about the enrollment and application process. If all questions are answered appropriately and indicate open enrollment, the school has "passed." An inappropriate answer would be one indicating

barriers to open enrollment, which would cause DC PCSB to call a second time and determine if the problem was an isolated incident or indicative of a systemic issue. If inappropriate answers are provided a second time, the school has failed and may be issued a Notice of Concern.

For SY 2022-23 three campuses failed due to responses that were perceived as SWD and EML open enrollment violations during both rounds. Two violations were for EML open enrollment, and one was for SWD. These three campuses received a Notice of Concern, and their staff had to attend mandatory training. This year's training focused on understanding the rules behind open enrollment and provided a space for schools to reflect and discuss their systems for communicating with families during enrollment season. In subsequent weeks, DC PCSB staff made follow-up mystery calls to the schools that received a Notice of Concern, and all campuses provided appropriate responses for each inquiry. The board then voted to lift each campus's Notice of Concern in June of 2023.

In January 2024, DC PCSB began its Mystery Caller Initiative for SY 2023-24. DC PCSB staff and consultants will continue to make calls to all campuses in operation during SY 2023-24 before the My School DC PK3-8 application deadline on March 1, 2024.

39. Describe any initiatives your agency implemented in fiscal years 2023 and 2024 (through January 31) aimed at improving the internal operation of PCSB or the interaction of PCSB with outside parties. Please describe the results, or expected results, of each initiative.

In FY 2023, we implemented the following initiatives aimed at improving our internal operations:

Standard Operating Procedures (SOP) – We completed a pilot for the creation of DC PCSB standard operating procedures. The pilot included procedures for the charter leaders meeting, LEA submission calendar, Wednesday Bulletin, and Tech & Data Appendix. These represent processes from a cross-section of department and agency functions. Feedback was collected from pilot participants and used to inform the full SOP system that is currently being implemented via a phased approach. This will allow us to have more efficient, consistent, and centralized knowledge sharing across the organization, and during transitions. The work to create and maintain SOPs is ongoing.

Courageous Conversations About Race: As a part of our commitment to racial equity diversity and inclusion, all staff attended Beyond Diversity- 1, a two-day training facilitated by Courageous Conversation™ using their award-

winning framework for achieving racial equity in education. Additionally, all people leaders at DC PCSB are participating in a four series training called Leadership for Equity and Anti-Racist Development (LEADS). The group has completed three of the four sessions and concluded in February 2024. This work has and will continue to facilitate rich conversations and interrogation of existing DC PCSB systems to ensure they are equitable and inclusive. Staff are developing a shared language and practices that will help DC PCSB deliver on our REDI commitments.

To date in FY 2024 we implemented the following initiatives aimed at improving our internal operations:

Knowledge Management: DC PCSB completed a Knowledge Management assessment which included interviews with management and staff to better understand current staff practices (storage, preferred repositories, onboarding/offboarding, system use, etc.) The results of the survey are being analyzed and synthesized to inform an approach to updated key knowledge management systems. These updates will help to ensure all DC PCSB staff have the resources and information needed to do their jobs well, and our internal systems are clear and easy to implement and navigate.

Professional Growth Plan Redesign: We gathered feedback from staff on our current performance evaluation system and are in the process of redesigning aspects of the current process. With this guidance, DC PCSB has identified priorities for the design of an updated professional growth planning system and will begin building it in the coming months. Already we applied for and were granted approval for a Performance Based Rewards Program from DCHR, a key milestone in the redesign process. The new system will be piloted in FY 2025. Updating our performance management system will support full realization of DC PCSB's talent philosophy that prioritizes continuous growth and development of all staff, an important aspect of retention.

41. How does PCSB communicate with and solicit feedback from education stakeholders, including parents and community members? For fiscal year 2024, please describe: (1) what PCSB has learned from this feedback; and (2) how PCSB has changed its practices as a result of such feedback.

A key component of DC PCSB’s engagement strategy continues to be soliciting feedback from parents, community leaders, residents, and education stakeholders. Over the last year, our efforts have focused heavily on engaging school leaders and staff on ASPIRE, DC PCSB’s proposed accountability system. We hosted over fifteen in-person opportunities for public charter school leaders and had a session for LEA board of trustee members, to discuss ASPIRE. In addition, we partnered with organizations such as the DC Charter School Alliance and MPD to convene schools to discuss various public safety issues. DC PCSB continues to strengthen relationships with local stakeholders in a variety of capacities, from LEA Boards to MPD. DC PCSB has used the learnings from the convenings to share with agency partners and with the School Enhancement Safety Committee.

DC PCSB values the input of caregivers and graduates of public charter schools. We meet monthly with our Parent and Alumni Leadership Council (PALC), which advises Board Members, the Executive Director, and DC PCSB leadership on policies, issues, and topics related to public charter schools. PALC comprises of parents of student(s) in a DC public charter school or graduates of a DC public charter school. Members live in every quadrant of the city and mostly reflect the demographics of public charter school students. Over the last year, PALC has offered feedback on the charter school application process, student support services, and other DC PCSB policies.

Lastly, as we do every year, DC PCSB participated in EdFest. This was an opportunity to hear directly from families about the school options they like in the city.

- **Staff**- concerns over the professionalism of staff or missing requisite teacher/service providers
- **Transportation** - concerns over access to school via public or school-provided transportation
- **Uniforms** - concerns with application of the school’s dress code/uniform policies
- **Other**- a concern that covers a topic not defined above or one that is systemic across various categories

45. Describe how PCSB coordinates with other D.C. government agencies with regard to new school openings and facilities planning. How does PCSB use facilities and planning data to inform decision? Of the newly authorized schools that opened and began operating in SY21-22 and SY22-23, please provide an update on their facilities status.

DC PCSB, DME, and DCPS meet monthly to discuss charter amendment requests to add, move, or reconfigure facilities. DCPS also presents information on upcoming facility plans and DME brings information on facility needs. DC PCSB representatives have also been active members of the Master Facilities Plan and Boundary and Student Assignment Study working groups.

Two new LEAs began operation in SY 2021 – 22: LEARN DC PCS and Global Citizens PCS. One new LEA opened in SY 2022 – 23: DC Wildflower PCS. All three LEAs secured a facility as a condition of their full charter approval. An update on their facilities can be found in the table below.

46. (a) Explain any emergency response procedures in place for PCSB.

(b) Explain the emergency response planning for LEAs as it relates to on-campus emergencies. Include in your response: (1) how PCSB receives information from District agencies to help guide emergency response activities and resource support requests; and (2) how PCSB

ensures schools are implementing the required safety plans, drills, and policies.

a. Below is an overview of emergency response procedures for DC PCSB:

Medical Emergency/ Procedures:

- Employees are to call 911 (Fire, Paramedics, Ambulance)
- Employees are to notify their supervisor and the Operations team of the emergency.
- Employees are to complete an incident report of the emergency within 24 hours and submit to the Operations Coordinator

Fire Evacuation/Emergency, Building Alarms Procedures

- In the event of fire, or the smell of smoke or gas, evacuate the building quickly and calmly. Employees should use stairwells –not elevators.
 - Employees should evacuate the building immediately at the sound of an alarm. Evacuation should be made via the nearest safe exit.
 - Employees should evacuate to the front/back door, whichever exit is closest, and stand at least 150 feet from the building.
 - Once employees have exited the building, under no circumstance are they allowed to re-enter a building that is in alarm. All employees and visitors are to meet at the water fountain directly across the street to wait for roll call. Once the roll call has been completed, staff may disburse to an alternative worksite should the emergency prevent staff from re-entry to the building. The fire department will issue an all-clear to the emergency coordinator/lead after the building has been deemed secure and alarms have been restored. Employees are to return to their workstations.
 - During an emergency, visitors who may not be familiar with the evacuation policy and plan. They must be informed of the procedures to evacuate. Special attention should be given to any persons with disabilities, especially those who are unfamiliar with the building. In the collection area (water fountain), the emergency coordinator/lead will also account for visitors and immediately report to the Fire Department and/or Building Fire Warden regarding any unaccounted persons.

Bomb Threat Procedures

- Employees should remain calm and complete bomb threat checklist.
- Employees are to notify their supervisor, the Operations team, and 911 of the threat.
- Employees are to complete an incident report of the emergency within 24 hours and submit to the Operations Coordinator.

- Employees are to follow the instructions of the fire and building evacuation per the recommendation of 911.

(b) Explain the emergency response planning for LEAs as it relates to on-campus emergencies. Include in your response: (1) how PCSB receives information from District agencies to help guide emergency response activities and resource support requests; and (2) how PCSB ensures schools are implementing the required safety plans, drills, and policies.

LEAs create and/or update emergency response plans for each of their campuses annually. Schools submit their plan every October, as set out in our LEA Submission Calendar, to DC's Emergency and Safety Alliance (ESA) portal. The plans need to demonstrate procedures, protocols, and drills in order to respond to potential crises (e.g., fire, tornado, earthquake, hurricane, lockdown, active shooter, health outbreak, and communicable diseases). Schools need to align their plans with the guidelines of agencies such as Fire and Emergency Medical Response Services Department (FEMS), Metropolitan Police Department (MPD), and Child and Family Services Agency (CFSA).

The Fire Marshal and DC PCSB's emergency response services consultant, Chris Lalik & Associates, review the plans through the ESA portal for completeness. It is DC PCSB's expectation that key school personnel be familiar with and prepared to follow the protocols for these emergency situations.

Schools have access to free support from Chris Lalik & Associates. They assist schools with developing emergency response plans, training staff to implement these plans, and conducting security audits of facilities. DC PCSB also participates in a working group led by DC Homeland Security Emergency Management Agency (HSEMA). This group provides DC PCSB the opportunity to bring forward the concerns of public charter schools. We also bring information back to school leaders on training opportunities and resources for emergency response activities.

47. (a) How many charter school applications has PCSB received in fiscal years 2023 and 2024 (through January 31)?

(b) Of those that applied, how many were given conditional approval to open?

(a) How many charter school applications has PCSB received in fiscal years 2023 and 2024 (through January 31)?

In fiscal year 2023, DC PCSB received one new school charter application: ISM Creative Academy. See the table below for an overview of the proposed school.

As of January 31, 2024, DC PCSB has yet to receive charter applications for its 2024 review cycle. Applications are due to DC PCSB by March 8, 2024, 9 a.m.

(b) Of those that applied, how many were given conditional approval to open?

On May 15, 2023, the Board voted to deny the application of ISM Creative Academy. No application received conditional approval.

(c) Provide a status update on the general operation and administration of the public charter schools that began operation in fiscal years 2023 and 2024 (through January 31).

No new LEAs began operation in fiscal years 2023 or 2024.

48. Describe PCSB's process and timeline for charter renewal. Include in your response the following information for fiscal years 2023 and 2024 (through January 31): (1) a list of public charter schools that were up for renewal, whether the public charter school was renewed, and the reasoning for that decision; (2) how PCSB communicated with each public charter school, its trustees, parents, and the surrounding community before making its renewal recommendation. Also include how PCSB encourages public charter school restart options or collaborations with charter operators during this process.

As required by the School Reform Act (SRA) DC PCSB authorizes public charter schools for 15-year terms. Once every five years during the 15-year period, and beyond, DC PCSB conducts a required review, which analyzes a school's: fulfillment of charter goals and academic achievement expectations (charter goals); compliance with its charter and applicable laws; and fiscal performance.

Schools submit a renewal application seeking authorization to continue operating during their fifteenth year of operation. Once the application is received, DC PCSB staff reviews and produces a renewal report detailing the findings of each of the previously mentioned areas. Prior to publishing the renewal report, DC PCSB staff gives the school time to review the report and suggest corrections to factual errors, which may lead to revisions to the report.

Following the report, the school will discuss its performance during a public board meeting and may request an informal hearing. DC PCSB's Board then votes to renew or not renew the school's charter. Per the SRA, DC PCSB shall not approve an application if it determines one or both of the following to be true:

- The school committed a material violation of applicable laws, or a material violation of the conditions, terms, standards, or procedures set forth in its charter, including violations relating to the education of children with disabilities; or
- The school failed to meet the goals and student academic achievement expectations set forth in its charter.

Additionally, DC PCSB must revoke a school's charter if it determines the school:

- Has engaged in a pattern of non-adherence to generally accepted accounting principles;
- Has engaged in a pattern of fiscal mismanagement; and/or is no longer economically viable.

The table below lists the schools that underwent renewal in FY 2023. There are no LEAs eligible for renewal in FY 2024.

(Note: Of the LEA's six campuses, its Trinidad campus, did not meet its goals outright, but rather met them via application of DC PCSB's COVID-19 Impact Provision. Therefore, a condition of renewal was imposed requiring the school to create, and annually report on, an academic improvement plan.
FY 2023	Washington Yu Ying PCS	Yes	The school met the standard of renewal under the law.

Throughout the renewal process, DC PCSB is in constant communication with public charter school leaders. DC PCSB staff holds pre-renewal meetings with each school up for renewal, where the process is thoroughly explained. During these meetings DC PCSB staff also share preliminary analysis of the school's charter goals.

DC PCSB will also host meetings with schools' Boards if they have demonstrated academic or financial weaknesses in the two years prior to their charter renewal. In these meetings school's leaders brief DC PCSB on the challenges they have faced and any mitigation efforts implemented. DC PCSB may share the consideration for an internal turnaround, where new staff replaces the school's leadership team and board members. DC PCSB will also share information regarding charter operators who could potentially acquire the struggling charter.

DC PCSB staff will notify the Advisory Neighborhood Commission (ANC) where the school is located to solicit community feedback, thirty business days before the public board meeting. The public may testify at the public meeting, submit a public comment through email, voice message, or letter. The opportunity to submit public comments is publicized on the DC PCSB website, social media, and the DC Register.

49. When considering a new charter application or charter renewal, how does PCSB assess the applicants' plan for, or track record of, provision of special education services? How much does this factor affect the approval or denial of an application or renewal?

New Charter Application

When evaluating a new charter school application, DC PCSB staff assesses how well "each element of the school program is deliberately designed to be inclusive of all students, including students with disabilities, English learners, students who are academically struggling or advanced, homeless students, and any other population(s) specifically targeted in the mission." This is found in the Inclusiveness standard of approval which is one of five criteria in DC PCSB's evaluation rubric.

When determining whether an applicant has met the Inclusiveness standard, a special populations reviewer looks for evidence that the applicant is well prepared to serve students with disabilities. Among the evidence the reviewer looks for is special education expertise on the founding team, well-designed plans to provide instruction inclusive of all learners across a continuum of services, strong compliance processes, and appropriate contingency planning. This is not the limit of evidence which the reviewer

considers. Staff use discretion when recommending a school for approval if the application meets the other four standards, but it does not meet the Inclusiveness standard. Staff have the option to recommend the Board approve an application with conditions if the applicant meets most standards for approval. In such a case, the conditioned approval would require the applicant to address the weaknesses in the application.

Once a new school opens, we track and monitor special education as defined in our new Special Education Audit and Monitoring Policy that was revised and approved by the DC PCSB Board in July of 2023.

Charter Renewal

The School Reform Act states that when a school is up for charter renewal, we must determine whether the school has “committed a material violation of applicable laws...including violations relating to the education of children with disabilities.” Given this legal requirement, DC PCSB staff summarize OSSE’s special education compliance findings in renewal reports.

In addition to the Annual Determination reports, in 2023 we updated our review and renewal template to include an explanation of OSSE’s new Special Education Performance Report (SEPR) scores and levels, and how it demonstrates the school’s capacity to serve students with disabilities. We also included a section in our review and renewal reports on DC PCSB’s audit and monitoring policy to indicate if the school’s climate or compliance data triggered the need for an audit or intervention during the review period. We also include the outcome of the audit in the report. The board takes this data in conjunction with overall academic and climate data in determining renewals or establishing conditions for renewals.

No public charter schools were closed, partially closed, slated for closure or charter revocation in FY 2023 or FY 2024 through January 31. Questions (c) and (d) are not applicable.
