Council Chairman Phil Mendelson announces a public hearing before the Committee of the Whole on Bill 25-800 "Mathematics Education Improvement Amendment Act of 2024." The public hearing will be held at **12:00 p.m. on Wednesday, November 6, 2024.** 

The stated purpose of Bill 25-800 is to establish a task force to improve kindergarten to 12<sup>th</sup> grade math achievement in the District. In school year 2022-2023, PARCC scores showed that only 22% of DC students met or exceeded the expectations for mathematics standards. Research has shown that math skills are highly correlated with later math achievement, reading achievement, and college attendance. Bill 25-800 requires the Office of the State Superintendent of Education (OSSE) to convene a taskforce made up of government agencies, mathematics education experts, and educators. The taskforce would be responsible for producing a report that recommends a District-wide approach to developing evidenced-based instructional materials, professional development for educators, and curricula to improve math education. The approach is similar to the approach taken with literacy, where OSSE convened a taskforce and produced a report released in the fall of 2023 (RC25-94). The Committee of the Whole encourages testimony about mathematics education generally, as well as about Bill 25-800.
