25	BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this
26	act may be cited as the "Emergency Rental Assistance Reform Emergency Amendment Act of

28	Sec. 2. Section 8f of the Homeless Services Reform Act of 2005, effective March 10,
29	2023 (D.C. Law 24-287; D.C. Official Code § 4-753.08) is amended as follows:
30	(a) Subsection (a)(2) is amended as follows:
31	(1) Subparagraph (A) is amended to read as follows:
32	"(2)(A) To qualify for Emergency Rental Assistance Funds, an applicant unit shall
33	be required to document:".
34	(2) Sub-subparagraph (v) is amended by striking the phrase "for payment." and
35	inserting the phrase "for payment; and".

36	(3) A new sub-subparagraph (vi) is added to read as follows:
37	"(vi) The nature of the emergency situation.".
38	(b) Subsection (a)(3) is repealed.
39	(c) Subsection (d)(3) is amended to read as follows:
40	"(3) "Emergency situation" means a situation in which immediate action is
41	necessary to avoid homelessness or eviction, to re-establish a rental home, or otherwise to
42	prevent displacement from a rental home, which is the result of an unforeseen or unusual event,
43	such as the loss of a job or high medical costs, that impacts the applicant unit's ability to pay rent
44	and that cannot be resolved without financial assistance.".
45	Sec. 3. Section 501(r) of the Rental Housing Act of 1985, effective July 17, 1985 (D.C.
46	Law 6-10; D.C. Official Code § 42-3505.01(r)) is amended to read as follows:
47	"(r)(1) The court may stay any proceedings for a claim brought by a housing provider to
48	recover possession of a rental unit for non-payment of rent if a tenant submits documentation to
49	the court demonstrating that he or she has a pending Emergency Rental Assistance Program
50	application; provided, that the court may stay proceedings pursuant to this subsection only once
51	during the pendency of the case and only if:
52	"(A) The tenant provides evidence that the application could result in
53	sufficient rental assistance to pay the full amount of unpaid rent owed by the tenant; or
54	"(B) The tenant and the housing provider have agreed in writing to a
55	repayment plan for the remaining balance of unpaid rent if the amount of rental assistance the
56	tenant is eligible to receive will not pay the full amount of unpaid rent owed by the tenant.
57	"(2) When an eviction that involves non-payment of rent has been authorized by
58	the court and a tenant notifies the housing provider that he or she has an approved Emergency

59 Rental Assistance Program application which would pay the full amount of unpaid rent owed by 60 the tenant no later than 48 hours prior to the scheduled date and time of the eviction, the housing 61 provider shall reschedule the eviction for a date no earlier than 3 weeks from the current 62 scheduled eviction date to allow for the application to be processed, a determination of funding 63 to be made, and, if the application is approved, funding to be distributed to the housing 64 provider.". 65 Sec. 4. This act shall take effect following approval by the Mayor (or in the event of veto by the Mayor, action by the Council to override the veto), a 30-day period of congressional review as provided in sections 602(c)(1) of the District of Columbia Home Rule Act, approved December 24, 1973 (87 Stat. 813; D.C. Official Code § 1-206.02(c)(1)), and publication in the District of Columbia Register.

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
