8	IN THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA

11	To declare the existence of an emergency, due to congressional review, with respect to the need
12	to allow the Alcoholic Beverage and Cannabis Board to issue temporary non-resident
13	registration identification cards that are valid for periods between 3 days and no longer
14	than one year in length, allow licensed testing laboratories to receive and test samples of
15	medical cannabis products from qualifying patients, allow licensed testing laboratories to
16	conduct quality assurance or research and development testing for cultivation centers and
17	manufacturers, amend the definition of a social equity applicant to include arrests and
18	convictions of qualifying family members for a cannabis or drug offense, expand the list
19	of eligible family members under the social equity applicant definition to include siblings
20	and grandparents, clarify that existing licensed cultivation centers and retailers, and
21	applicants that scored 150 points or more during the open application period that
22	occurred between November 29, 2021 and March 28, 2022 that are authorized by statute
23	to receive a cultivation center, manufacturer, or retailer license apart from a designated
24	open application period are not counted in calculating the 50% set aside requirement,
25	clarify that the 5 cultivation center registration applicants that scored 150 points or more
26	during the same open application period shall automatically receive a manufacturer
27	license provided they pay the annual fee and register with the ABC Board, allow the
28	Alcoholic Beverage and Cannabis Board to issue conditional licenses to testing
29	laboratory applicants, and to waive the application fee for testing laboratory licenses.

32	RESOLVED, BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this
33	resolution may be cited as the "Medical Cannabis Clarification and Non-Resident Patient Access
34	Congressional Review Emergency Declaration Resolution of 2024".
35	Sec. 2. (a) There existed an immediate need to issue temporary non-resident registration
36	identification cards that are valid for periods between 3 days and no longer than one year in
37	length and to waive the application fee for testing laboratory licenses, among other things.

38	(b) In July 2024, the Council enacted the Medical Cannabis Clarification and Non-
39	Resident Patient Access Emergency Amendment Act of 2024, effective July 9, 2024 (D.C. Act
40	25-527; 71 DCR 9593), ("emergency legislation") and the Medical Cannabis Clarification and
41	Non-Resident Patient Access Temporary Amendment Act of 2024, passed on 2 nd reading on
42	September 17, 2024 (Enrolled version Bill 25-903) ("temporary legislation") to address the
43	above-mentioned issues.
44	(c) The emergency legislation expires on October 21, 2024. The temporary legislation
45	must still complete the 30-day review period required by section 602(c)(1) of the District of
46	Columbia Home Rule Act, approved December 24, 1973 (87 Stat. 813; D.C. Official Code § 1-
47	206.02(c)(1)), and will not become law until after the emergency legislation has expired.
48	(d) Comprehensive permanent legislation addressing these issues has been introduced but
49	must complete the legislative process.
50	(e) It is necessary that the provisions of the emergency legislation continue in effect,
51	without interruption, until the temporary legislation is in effect.
52	Sec. 3. The Council determines that the circumstances enumerated in section 2 constitute
53	emergency circumstances making it necessary that the Medical Cannabis Clarification and Non-
54	Resident Patient Access Congressional Review Emergency Amendment Act of 2024 be adopted
55	after a single reading.
56	Sec. 4. This resolution shall take effect immediately.
