(a) The Mayor and DC Arena L.P. (DCALP) are proposing to enter into 27 agreements whereby the District will acquire the existing Capital One Arena building, lease the 28 arena building and underlying land to DCALP, and provide funds to support the renovation of the 29 arena in order for it to remain a world-class sports and entertainment space. 30 (b) Under the agreements, DCALP will fully renovate the inside and outside of the arena 31 to improve the fan experience and will contribute \$372.5 million to the renovation project. The 32 agreements will ensure that DCALP will keep the Wizards and Capitals in the District through at 33 least 2050.

(c) Together, the District and DCALP are committing approximately \$800 million in
project investment to revitalize the arena and surrounding environs. The renovated arena will
help revitalize the Chinatown/Gallery Place neighborhood, create quality new jobs for District
residents, and strengthen a commitment to community and fan engagement.
(d) In order for the District and DCALP to move forward with the project, the Council

- (d) In order for the District and DCALP to move forward with the project, the Council must approve the agreements and enact conforming legislation.
- (e) Emergency legislation is necessary to allow for the commencement of work on the project on an expedited basis.
 - Sec. 3. The Council determines that the circumstances enumerated in section 2 constitute emergency circumstances making it necessary that the that the Downtown Arena Revitalization Emergency Act of 2024 be adopted after a single reading.
- Sec. 4. This resolution shall take effect immediately.
