16	WHEREAS, the Washington Commanders have experienced a remarkable resurgence in
17	the 2024-2025 NFL season, finishing the regular season with a 12-5 record and securing the sixth
18	seed in the National Football Conference playoffs, a testament to the collective effort and
19	determination of the players, coaches, and staff;

21	WHEREAS, Coach Quinn's strategic acumen led the Commanders to their first playoff
22	appearance since 2020 and their first playoff victory since 2005, with a 23–20 win over the
23	Tampa Bay Buccaneers in the Wild Card round;

25	WHEREAS, the Commanders continued their remarkable postseason run by defeating
26	the top-seeded Detroit Lions 45–31 in the Divisional Round, advancing to the NFC
27	Championship Game for the first time since 1991;
28	
29	WHEREAS, rookie quarterback Jayden Daniels has emerged as a transformative leader
30	for the Washington Commanders, completing 69% of his passes for 3,568 yards, throwing 25
31	touchdowns, and rushing for 891 yards and 6 touchdowns during the regular season, showcasing
32	his dual-threat capabilities;
33	
34	WHEREAS, the Washington Commanders offensive line has demonstrated remarkable
35	resilience and strength, allowing the fewest sacks in the NFC and providing crucial protection for
36	the quarterback, as well as paving the way for a balanced and dynamic running game;
37	
38	WHEREAS, the Commanders' offense tied for the second-most total points in a season in
39	franchise history, scoring 485 points, and ranked among the top three in rushing and total yards;
40	
41	WHEREAS, the Commanders' receiving corps, led by Terry McLaurin, Jahan Dotson,
42	and Curtis Samuel, has consistently delivered explosive plays and key contributions, helping
43	propel the offense to one of the best in the league;

45	WHEREAS, the Commanders have shown a strong commitment to community
46	engagement, exemplified by initiatives such as the "Commanders Day of Service," which
47	includes youth football clinics, partnerships with local museums, and support for public charter
48	schools;
49	
50	WHEREAS, wide receiver Terry McLaurin set a franchise record with 13 touchdown
51	receptions in a single season, earning him a second-team All-Pro selection;
52	
53	WHEREAS, on January 30, 1983, the Commanders defeated the Miami Dolphins with a
54	score of 27-17, marking their first Super Bowl victory;
55	
56	WHEREAS, on January 31, 1988, the Commanders triumphed over the Denver Broncos
57	with a decisive 42-10 win, showcasing a record-breaking performance, marking their second
58	Super Bowl victory;

60	WHEREAS, on January 26, 1992, the Washington Commanders secured their third
61	Super Bowl title by defeating the Buffalo Bills 37-24, demonstrating exceptional skill and
62	teamwork;

64	RESOLVED, BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, this resolution
65	may be cited as the "Washington Commanders Recognition Resolution of 2025".
