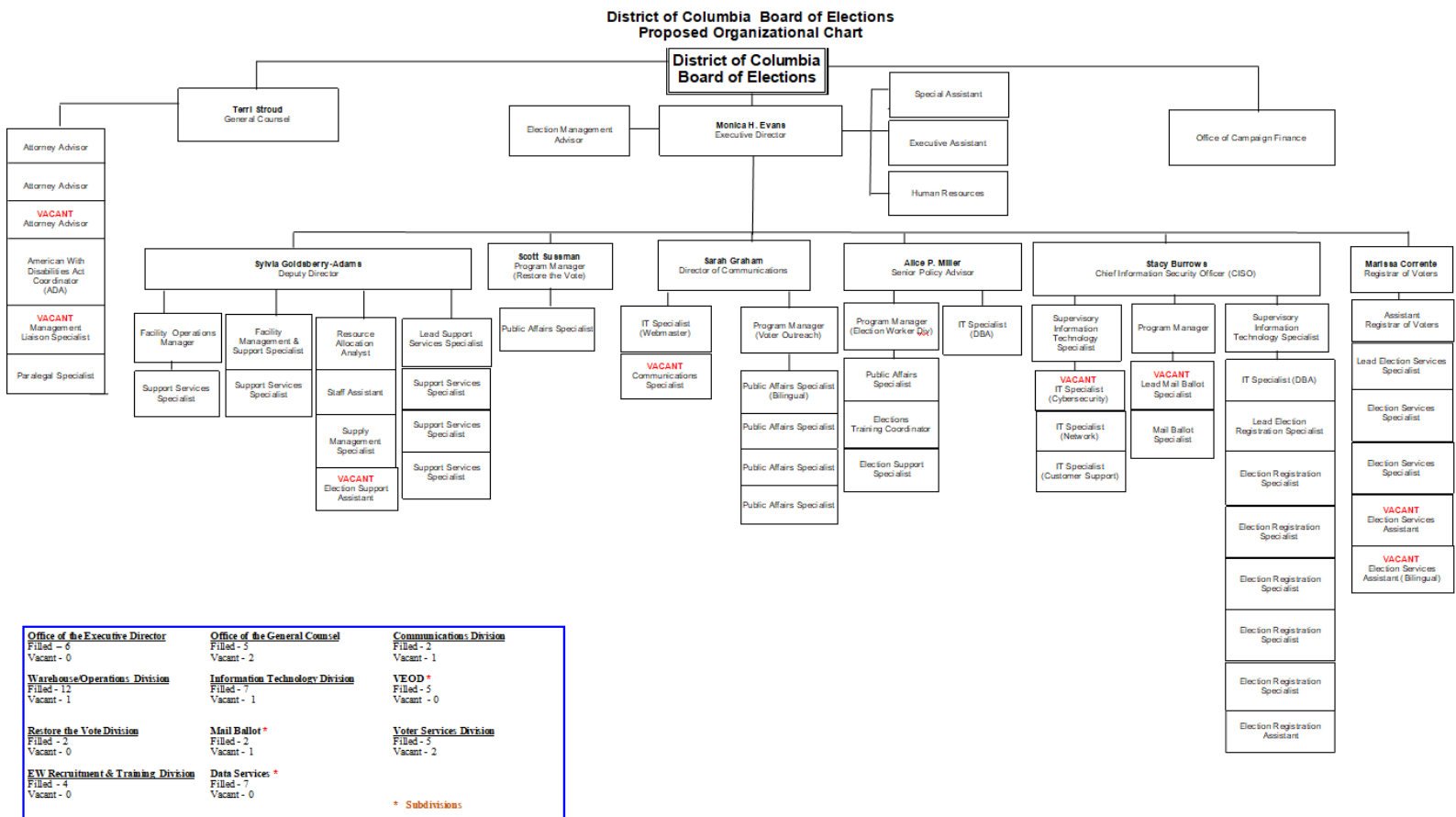

RESPONSE:

OFFICE THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF DUTIES: The Executive Director serves as the DC Board of Elections' primary management official in directing program operations and support activities. The Office of the Executive Director provides high level leadership and guidance and direction to subordinate divisions in the areas of voter registration and services, administration, IT, outreach, and training. Duties of the Executive Director include:

- Developing and directing the organizational machinery and procedures necessary to ensure the effective and efficient administration and execution of the election statutes of the District of Columbia;
- Reviewing all agency programs, plans and operations for adequacy and conformance with the policies of the Board;
- Assisting the Board and the General Counsel in the review of legislative proposals and development of agency regulations affecting agency operations in the delivery of election services; and
- Serving as the primary point of contact for the agency.

OFFICE OF THE GENERAL COUNSEL

BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF DUTIES: The Office of the General Counsel represents the DC Board of Elections in all judicial and administrative proceedings relating to elections, voter registration, and campaign finance; proposes and drafts regulations consistent with legislation; researches, reviews, analyzes, and interprets pertinent court decisions, District and federal laws, rules, regulations, and other legal resources; ensures agency compliance with all relevant District and federal laws, including reporting requirements; discusses with public officials, candidates, attorneys, members of the public, and other interested parties legal questions involving the application of election laws, and gives guidance where appropriate; responds to Freedom of Information Act requests; and reviews all agency publications to ensure legal accuracy.

WAREHOUSE OPERATIONS AND LOGISTICAL DIVISION

BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF DUTIES: The Warehouse Operations & Logistical Division is responsible for the maintenance of equipment and voting systems; the programming, coding, and testing of voting systems; conducting inventory of election materials for all polling sites; procuring

polling place supplies and election equipment for property disposal efforts; ballot distribution and security; managing the agency's facilities and telecommunication needs; identifying and conducting site surveys to ensure adequacy, accessibility, and availability of polling sites; for coordinating Intra-District agency support; packing and assembling election materials for distribution to polling places; processing mail sent to and from BOE; providing voter outreach event logistics; and operating and collecting ballots from drop boxes.

RESTORE THE VOTE DIVISION

BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF DUTIES: The Restore the Vote Division provides voter registration and outreach services to incarcerated District residents at Federal Bureau of Prison facilities and the Department of Corrections. This division will support the Restore the Vote initiative, which gives the right to vote back to approximately 4,500 DC residents who are currently incarcerated for a felony conviction. The Division ensures compliance with the Restore the Vote Legislation.

VOTER EDUCATION AND OUTREACH DIVISION:

BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF DUTIES: The Voter Education and Outreach Division (VEOD) serves as the centralized resource for public information about the DC Board of Elections to the community through the news media, social media, agency website, and public events. The VEOD is responsible for conducting a variety of engagement opportunities for the public, to include education on voter's rights and responsibilities, voting equipment demonstrations, voter registration drives, and the recruitment of poll workers and ward coordinators. The goal of this office is to provide the most accurate and timely information to the public and to ensure that all eligible voters in the District are provided with accurate information and access to the Board's services with respect to outreach activities.

COMMUNICATIONS DIVISION

BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF DUTIES: The Communications Division is responsible for overseeing multi-faceted, comprehensive, internal and external communications strategies to execute the DC Board of Elections' mission and goals through various means, including but not limited to: online and print channels, media relations, social media, the DC Board of Elections website, and public events. Additionally, this division is responsible for reputational management, branding, and facilitating interviews, briefings, or press conferences for members of the media, as well as coordinating and managing the creation and development of collateral materials that include writing, editing, logistical planning with graphic design and print vendors, productions, and disseminations. Works

with the media in a proactive manner to identify news opportunities and ensure positive news stories about the DC Board of Elections.

ELECTION WORKER RECRUITMENT AND TRAINING DIVISION

BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF DUTIES: The Election Worker Recruitment and Training Division (Election Worker Division) recruits DC residents from all eight wards within the District of Columbia who will work during Early Voting and on Election Day. The Division identifies election workers on a continuing basis by recruiting workers at community events held throughout DC year round. The goal and mission is to adequately staff Vote Centers by recruiting, training, and deploying thousands of election workers for both Primary and General Elections.

Another responsibility of the Election Worker Division is to effectively operate the agency's call center that is staffed with a seasonal workforce that begins operating a minimum of three months in advance of an election. Call center operators are responsible for contacting and scheduling over 3,000 election workers for a mandatory four-hour training class. The division identifies and trains instructors to conduct ten to twelve weeks of training for over 200 classes held Monday-Saturday prior to every election. The Election Worker Division ensures each election worker receives detailed hands-on instruction and training tailored to one of the four different roles that must be performed in each Vote Center on Election Day. The division also prepares a polling place operations manual that is given to each election worker.

During non-election years, the Division makes adjustments to the election process based upon lessons learned, survey feedback, and evaluations of election workers. The Election Worker Division conducts continuing election worker training for Precinct Captains, Special Ballot Clerks and Check-in Clerks. As part of the continuous improvement process, the Division implements new developments and best practices identified in the election community. They are also charged with maintaining ongoing communication with election workers to ensure their continued commitment to and interest with supporting the election process.

INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY DIVISION

BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF DUTIES: The Information Technology Division (IT Division) provides both strategic IT vision and cost-effective technology solutions for accomplishing BOE's mission of enfranchising eligible residents, conducting elections, and assuring the integrity of the electoral process.

The IT Division is responsible for continued development and maintenance of technology policies, network management, software upgrades, and website enhancements. It is the responsibility of this division to enhance the level of training necessary to maintain the highest

level of competency. Further, the division works to ensure that IT staff is properly trained to achieve the optimal level of competency in managing the current and evolving business technology and election technological initiatives.

In addition, the IT division oversees mobile and online technology and provides accurate information to BOE stakeholders. The IT division continuously monitors and improves the D.C. Board of Elections' security posture by maintaining up-to-date security solutions for all information systems, and collaborating with OCTO's Security Division and federal partners to remain abreast of Advanced Persistent Threats and other critical infrastructure possible vulnerabilities.

DATA SERVICES DIVISION

BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF DUTIES: The Data Services Division qualifies voter registration applications received from multiple sources to determine if applicants are eligible to register and vote. As part of list maintenance of the voter registration roll, the D.C. Board of Elections conducts biennial voter maintenance and sends address confirmation cards to voters who do not vote in general elections. The division processes correspondence received and acts accordingly to update the voter roll. In addition to regular voter maintenance, this division processes voter ID cards, coordinates with the Electronic Registration Information Center (ERIC) mailings and provides notices to other jurisdictions. The division also processes vote by mail for military and overseas voters by processing absentee request and voting transactions, including data entry for ballot mailing/tracking. It determines voter registration status for processing ballot measure petitions, special/challenged ballots, and candidate challenges. Maintains and manages voter history, master street index, creates elections and assigns appropriate ballot styles, the poll workers and voter roll database and responds to data requests and produces multiple reports required by the agency.

MAIL BALLOT PROCESSING DIVISION

BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF DUTIES: The Mail Ballot Processing Division is designed to oversee and ensure the accurate and efficient processing of the election ballots. Through ensuring compliance with election laws and regulations and maintaining the integrity of the election process by managing every aspect of the mail ballot process, including list maintenance, signature verification, and the public viewing processes.

VOTER SERVICES DIVISION

BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF DUTIES: The Voter Services Division is the first point of contact for most residents entering in the election process either by registering as a first time voter, seeking ballot access, or filing ballot measures for presentation before the voters. This unit is a key source for voter information.

This team staffs the office lobby, assisting the public as needed, answers all incoming main-line agency phone calls, and processes the mail. Responsible for the support and processing of confidential voters. This division also hosts brown bag training for candidates, processes all initiative, referendum and recall petitions to determine sufficiency, and oversees challenges associated with any petition filing. Responsible for various election-related functions such as ballot requests, special ballot determinations, post random audits, and recounts.

As of June 1, 2025 through May 31, 2026, the Option Period Three extension will cost BOE \$462,904.00. We currently have a balance of \$515,499.00 remaining in capital funds.

All FY24 performance plan objectives were met and completed on time and within budget except for the ones indicated below:

BOE did not meet its target with respect to the target number of District of Columbia residents who are registered to vote each month. We averaged 2,572 voters per month instead of 3,000.

While we did not hit our target of 100% with respect to the following key performance indicators, we performed at 90% or above with respect to each of them:

Percent of polling places open on time on Election Day:	91.4%
Percent of voting equipment open on time on Election Day:	94.3%
Percent of poll workers who complete and submit required post-election documentation:	93.3%
Percent of special ballots processed correctly in elections held in the fiscal year:	98.2%
Percent of precincts that successfully electronically transmit election results to Board headquarters on election night:	90%

BOE did not meet its target with respect to the target percentage of polling places that were operationally accessible. 70% of the polling places used in the primary election were deemed by University Legal Services to be operationally inaccessible. When election workers or ADA Compliance Assistants identified or were made aware of operational inaccessibility issues, they immediately took action, where possible, to correct these circumstances. To mitigate operational inaccessibility issues, the election worker training was modified to emphasize accessibility and its importance. As such, each election worker received accessibility training for the 2024 election cycle.

Explore options to maintain an accurate and up-to-date voter registry through consistent use of data yielded from the Electronic Registration Information Center (ERIC); the State and Territorial Exchange of Vital Events (STEVE) database; the National Change of Address (NCOA) and Social Security databases. In addition to working with ERIC and the national databases, we are reaching out to universities and exploring information sharing opportunities with the credit reporting bureaus.

Develop engaging and targeted voter education and outreach programs and materials that will educate all potential and existing voters - including the youth, senior citizens, people with disabilities, people with language access needs, returning citizens, incarcerated citizens, underrepresented populations, *etc.* - not only about BOE programs and processes, but also about their rights and responsibilities in the electoral process, and how they can contribute to the successful administration of elections. BOE will also provide education and outreach around newly enacted legislation. This priority will entail the involvement of a consultant or organization to assist with converting materials to plain language.

Enhance the IT Division by hiring a cybersecurity staff person and developing additional standard operating procedures to assist with the Board's mission and maintain security of the infrastructure.

32. Please describe any considerations that are currently underway in preparation for the 2026 elections. In your response, please provide a timeline for planning for the elections.

RESPONSE: The Automatic Voter Registration Amendment Act will be effective for the 2026 Election Cycle. We are currently working with the Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) to ensure compliance. Eligible voters who decline to register to vote at the DMV will be placed into a pending file. BOE will follow up with those individuals to give them additional opportunities to register and vote.

BOE is also exploring equipment purchases and upgrades. Specifically, we are exploring the following equipment acquisitions:

- **KnowInk Technology Upgrade:** Outdated iPads used for voter check-in will soon be incompatible with future software updates. This funding will replace these devices with newer models to ensure continued security and operational efficiency.
- **ES&S Technology Upgrade:** The BOE currently relies on aging ES&S election equipment, including ExpressVote machines and DS200 ballot scanners, which are approaching the end of their lifecycles. Replacing them with secure, modern systems is essential for maintaining election integrity and accessibility.
- **Web Hosting:** After a breach in October 2023 exposed sensitive voter data, this request aims to secure a new web hosting provider to enhance the security, accessibility, and overall performance of BOE's platform.

33. Please describe any considerations that are currently underway for any special elections in FY25. Please outline preparations that must be undertaken to hold a special election and discuss the timeline for holding a special election.

RESPONSE: We are aware of at least one special election that will be held in FY 25. On February 4, the DC Council voted to expel the Ward 8 Councilmember. We will certify the vacancy at a meeting to be held on Friday, February 14. The special election will provide in-person and mail-in ballot voting. The election calendar is being developed.

36. Please describe public outreach conducted by the Board related the 2024 general and primary elections. Please include preparations in the lead up to the election as well as post-election outreach.

RESPONSE: The DC Board of Elections (the Board) Voter Education and Outreach Division is committed to providing equal and accessible opportunities for District residents to register to vote and to learn about the voting process and District elections. Proactive and inclusive voter outreach increase meaningful participation of all eligible voters. To increase voter registration among District residents, particularly those in marginalized and vulnerable communities, the Board took an intentional approach to conducting public outreach and education efforts in advance of the 2024 general and primary elections. Through strategic partnerships, the Board focused its efforts on building voter awareness, perception and confidence among residents of marginalized and vulnerable communities and groups. In addition, the Board identified and secured new partnerships with numerous community organizations, non-profits, high schools, colleges, senior facilities, and other stakeholder groups to expand voter engagement opportunities and increase voter registration statistics in the District.

From January to November 2024, the Board actively participated in approximately 335 outreach events, with 164 events held prior to the General Election. These events

included voter education and registration activities facilitated at high schools, colleges, senior facilities, homeless shelters, recreation centers, and libraries.

There were no post-election outreach activities conducted.

37. Please describe the audit procedure for District elections. Please describe any audits that were initiated, ongoing, or completed in FY24 and FY25 to date, including any audits of the 2024 general and primary elections. How long are ballots retained for auditing purposes?

RESPONSE: The Board is required to conduct a public manual audit after each General and Special Election. See D.C. Official Code § 1– 1001.09a(b) and Title 3 DCMR § 812.2. To ensure the integrity of the election process, the Board also conducts a public manual audit after each Primary Election as well.

In advance of the post-election audit, the Board publicly conducts a random selection of the precincts to be audited, as well as the District-wide contest and the two ward-wide contests. During the public post-election audit, Board staff conduct a hand count of the ballots for each precinct and contest, tallying the results. The counting staff are not given the corresponding machine tally results. Following the completion of the audit, the Board publishes a report on the Board’s website before the certification of the official election results. See D.C. Official Code § 1– 1001.09a and Title 3 DCMR §§ 803 and 812.

The public manual audit for the 2024 Primary Election took place on June 26, 2024; the results were reported on the Board’s website on June 28, 2024. The public manual audit for the 2024 General Election took place on November 22 and 25, 2024; the results were reported on the Board’s website on November 26, 2024.

Pursuant to D.C. Official Code § 1– 1001.09(j) and Title 3 DCMR § 811.3, ballots are securely stored for 22 months. Following that period, the ballots are destroyed – as long as there is no pending litigation or procedures wherein the ballots may be needed for evidence.

38. Please describe public outreach conducted by the Board in FY24 related to voter registration. Please describe any specific outreach conducted for high schoolers, youth in detainment centers, senior citizens, returning or incarcerated citizens, unhoused voters, and non-resident voters. Voter education and voter registration among youth in detainment centers, returning citizens, and incarcerated residents remained a priority for the Restore the Vote (RTV) Division in FY24. RTV met the needs of these populations through individual efforts as well as by working with other stakeholders with common goals. Examples

of efforts to provide educational and registration opportunities include but are not limited to:

- Events held in cooperation with the DC Court Services and Offender Supervision Agency (CSOSA) for returning citizens that were recently released and still under supervision
- Drives and other activities held in cooperation with the DC Ready Center for recently released DC residents
- Events held in cooperation with the Mayor's Office of Returning Citizens Affairs (MORCA)
- Support of youth incarcerated at two Department of Youth Rehabilitation Services (DYRS) youth detention facilities (Youth Services Center and New Beginnings)
- Registration drives in support of returning citizens in homeless shelters
- Events in support of DC residents assigned to halfway houses
- Support of incarcerated DC residents in Federal Bureau of Prison (BOP) facilities (in-person and remote presentations, and mass mailings and emailing campaigns) including a classroom curriculum conducted in conjunction with the League of Women Voters
- Voter education and registration drives for DC residents incarcerated at the DC Department of Corrections (DOC)
- Voter education and registration drives for DC residents housed in incarceration facilities surrounding DC, such as:
 - The Arlington Detention Center
 - The Montgomery County Detention Center
 - The Montgomery County Pre-release Center
 - The PG County Jail

41. Please describe the National Voter Registration Act trainings conducted with VRAs by the Board. Please summarize the content of the trainings and discuss any updates that have been made to the content. Please also provide the number of trainings conducted in FY24 and FY25 to date by agency.

RESPONSE:

Every fiscal year the Board attempts to meet with each of the 14 Voter Registration Agencies separately to either train or review voter registration requirements under the National Voter Registration Act with their designated VRA Coordinator. Our training will include procedures for providing voter registration forms and/or voter preference forms to each individual initially requesting or applying for services at a VRA, or changing his or her address, recordkeeping requirements and ensuring staff and volunteers are trained to perform their NVRA duties.

The training is generally between 1.0 and 1.5 hours. The training takes place at one of the Board's training rooms or at agency site, to be determined later.

The training material includes an agency manual and five (5) part video. Part 1, The history of the NVRA; Part 2, The Voter Preference Form; Part 3, The Voter Registration Application; Part 4, The Monthly Reporting Form; and Part 5, The Summary.

At the conclusion of each training session the participants are given a quiz which is immediately corrected and scored after each session.

One or two weeks after training the Board follows up by sending each VRA its own individual posters with a QR Code for that agency to post around their locations and any other voter registration material they may need.

Approximately 2-3 months after each training we attempt to visit each VRA to walk-through and evaluate their procedures for compliance with the NVRA.

RESPONSE: Ward Outreach Coordinators serve as Board Ambassadors and an extension of the Voter Education and Outreach Division (VEOD). Ward Outreach Coordinators assist VEOD team members with conducting outreach to District seniors in all eight wards. In FY24, the Ward Outreach Coordinators facilitated voter registration and education activities at nursing homes, rehabilitation centers and senior residential facilities. In addition, the Ward Outreach Coordinators staffed community outreach events, led voting equipment demonstrations, and provided timely and relevant election information across all eight wards. With great assistance from the Ward Outreach Coordinators, the Board successfully engaged and educated numerous seniors in advance of the 2024 elections.

RESPONSE: The role of the Board regarding vacancies varies dependent on what seat becomes vacant. Generally, though, the Board receives formal notification that a vacancy has occurred and then certifies the seat as vacant. Public notice is placed in the D.C. Register and on the Board's website, and the required parties are notified. Board staff

facilitate the ballot access process for eligible candidates. Then depending on the seat, the Board facilitates a Special Election. For ANC Vacancies, Board staff certify the seat as filled if one candidate qualifies or notify the ANC of the need to coordinate an ANC vacancy election if multiple candidates qualify.

RESPONSE: Petitions are not put on ballots. Petitions are a part of the process by which candidates and ballot measures gain ballot access. Within the category of ballot measures, there are different types that can be put on a ballot, including initiatives, referenda, and recalls. The recall measure process has some similarities to the process for initiative and referendum measures, but there are also distinct differences between each process. For recalls, see D.C. Official Code §§ 1-204.112 and 1-1001.17 and Chapter 11 of Title 3 of the D.C. Municipal Regulations. For initiative and referendum measures, see D.C. Official Code § 1-1001.16 and Chapter 10 of Title 3 of the D.C. Municipal Regulations.

As the Board indicated it would in its response to last year’s POH questions, the Board placed a highlighted warning against illegal voting activity on mail ballot envelopes, placed warnings against illegal voting activity on its website, and had the

Communications Division post messages about illegal voting on social media. The Board has also assessed civil penalties and referred matters for prosecution upon findings of voter fraud and violations of voting laws as indicated in the response to Q48.

49. Please outline the process and average length of time to investigate a violation based on the type of violation alleged.

RESPONSE:

An investigation commences when there is sufficient evidence of a violation for the Office of General Counsel (“OGC”) to issue a notice of a pre-hearing conference. The OGC gathers the evidence, including the statements made during the pre-hearing conference. If the evidence shows that no violation occurred or it is not plausible that a culprit can be identified, the matter is not pursued. If the evidence is sufficient to support a recommendation of enforcement, the evidence is provided to the Board and the matter is set for a Board hearing at which the General Counsel makes a recommendation with respect to enforcement action.

The average number of days to close out cases by type is as follows: eligibility fraud: 60; double voting: 161; wrong ballot: 113; petition fraud: 65.

50. Please describe the Board’s work with federal agencies, including the Election Assistance Commission, the Federal Election Commission, the Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency, the United States Postal Service, the Department of Justice, and any other agencies.

RESPONSE:

The OGC cooperates with the FBI and the U.S. Department of Justice in enforcement matters.

51. Please explain the impact on your agency of any legislation passed or regulations adopted at the federal level during FY24 and FY25 to date which significantly affects agency operations.

RESPONSE: Currently, there are regulations or legislation that have been passed or adopted at the federal level that affect agency operations. Legislation has been introduced, but nothing has passed. However, President Trump revoked the Executive Order that compelled the Federal Bureau of Prisons (BOP) to assist eligible voters with voting. While this is a setback, we will continue our own outreach efforts to the BOP.

52. Please outline any federal legislation or pending actions from federal agencies that the Board is monitoring which may significantly impact agency operations.

RESPONSE: Rep Pfluger introduced a bill (H.R. 884) to prohibit noncitizens from voting in D.C. and to repeal D.C.'s Local Resident Voting Rights Amendment Act of 2022.

BOE expects the American Confidence in Elections (ACE) Act to be reintroduced by Congress. Congress finds that it has the authority to establish the terms and conditions for the administration of elections for public office in the District of Columbia. The ACT Act would significantly restrict voter registration and voting practices in DC.

53. Please provide the amount of any Help America Vote Act ("HAVA") funds expended in FY24 and FY25 to date. Please note the purposes of the expenditures and the BOE's projected use for any remaining funds.

RESPONSE: HAVA funds are used to support staff travel for continuing education, conferences, and seminars focused on key topics such as election processes, cybersecurity and related fields. This professional development ensures that staff stay informed on the latest trends, technologies, and regulatory changes. By attending these events, staff can expand their expertise, exchange best practices, and bring valuable insights back to BOE enhancing our capacity to manage critical areas like election security and other challenges.

54. How does the Board work with other jurisdictions to prevent voters from voting in multiple jurisdictions?

RESPONSE:

BOE currently maintains a membership with the Electronic Registration Information Center (ERIC). In adherence to their membership agreement, the BOE actively collaborates with ERIC by sharing voter registration and motor vehicle licensee data every 60 days. This collaborative effort aims to enhance the accuracy of voter rolls. Notably, since June 2022, the BOE has consistently provided ERIC with both DMV and BOE voter registration records.

Virginia is a “non-ERIC” jurisdiction. BOE has entered into a memorandum of understanding with Virginia to obtain information that is similar to what ERIC provides.

56. Please describe the BOE's use of the Electronic Registration Information Center (ERIC). Please include:

- a. Any costs associated with the use of the system;

RESPONSE:

DCBOE pays an annual membership fee to ERIC, which varies based on the jurisdiction's size and is determined by ERIC's governing board. The membership dues are processed through the CFO's Office of Finance and Resource Management. For the period from July 1, 2024, to June 30, 2025, the Board of Elections has made a payment of \$37,163.00.

- b. Description of information provided to and received from the system;

RESPONSE:

At least every 60 days, DCBOE submits voter registration data and licensing and identification data from the DC Department of Motor Vehicles (DC DMV) to ERIC. ERIC's technical staff then uses data-matching software to compare our records with those from other ERIC member states, the Death Master Index (DMI) which includes information from the Social Security Administration, and other trusted sources. This process generates several key reports that assist us in maintaining accurate voter records:

List Maintenance Reports

- Cross-State Movers Report – Identifies voters who may have moved out of the District by comparing voter registration and DMV records across ERIC member states.
- In-State Updates Report – Flags voters who may have moved within the District or updated their contact information.
- Duplicate Report – Identifies potential duplicate registrations within the District.
- Deceased Report – Detects deceased voters using Social Security Administration Death Master Index data, DMV records, and voter registration information.

Additional Reports

- Eligible but Unregistered Report – Identifies individuals who appear eligible to vote but are not yet registered, helping us conduct voter outreach. This report is received every 2 years before the federal General election.
- Voter Participation Report - This report identifies potential instances of illegal voting activity, including voters who may have cast ballots in multiple states, submitted more than one ballot within the District, or exhibited signature discrepancies. This report is received once every 2 years after the federal General election.

- c. Data privacy considerations;

RESPONSE:

DCBOE takes strong measures to protect voter information and keep it secure when using the ERIC. We ensure that data is handled safely, shared only through secure methods, and use only for list maintenance and outreach purposes. Before submitting any voter data to ERIC, we employ advanced hashing and encryption techniques to ensure that sensitive information is secure. This process converts the original data into a unique string of characters that prevents unauthorized access or misuse during transmission.

BOE and ERIC uses a secure File Transfer Protocol (SFTP) site, which ensures encrypted transfer of the information between our systems and ERIC's for the transmission of data. The use of SFTP guarantees that any

data transmitted over the internet is protected from interception, ensuring a secure channel for communication.

- d. The number of investigations instigated in FY24 on the basis of information received from the system.

RESPONSE:

In FY24, the Office of General Counsel began investigations using information provided by ERIC, BOE and other member states. Of the 95 cases reported for 2022, seven investigations were initiated in 2024.

57. In the agency's 2024 Performance Oversight Hearing prehearing responses, the Board indicated that "investigations into the 2020 General Election ERIC report cases were suspended during the 2022 election cycle and further work on the 2022 General Election cases will be suspended as all staff must be focused on the elections when the Board is in an election cycle." Have these investigations been resumed? Please detail the current backlog of ERIC report cases including the election cycle in which the case initiated.

RESPONSE:

All 2020 General Election ERIC report cases have been resolved. Investigations into 2022 cases have started. Of the 95 cases for 2022 reported by ERIC, the Office of General Counsel was able in 2024 to start investigations into seven (*see* matters dated 7/24/2024 in chart provided in response to question 48 above).

58. Has the Board received the ERIC report from the 2024 election cycle? Please indicate the number of cases reported for the 2024 election cycle or note when the Board anticipates receiving this report.

RESPONSE:

As of today, the Board has not yet received the ERIC Voter Participation report for the 2024 election cycle. The initial kickoff meeting took place on Friday, January 25, 2025, and ERIC is currently in the process of collecting voter history data from other member states.

59. Please describe any actions the Board is taking to secure voter registration information and prevent data breaches such as the one that occurred in 2023 with DataNet.

RESPONSE:

The Board of Elections is dedicated to protecting voter registration data and enhancing our cybersecurity measures to prevent potential breaches. As part of this commitment, BOE is actively working on a range of security improvements and modernization initiatives, including:

Enhanced Endpoint Security & IT Hygiene:

BOE is working with OCTO Security to automate, streamline, and improve endpoint management across our infrastructure. This initiative will ensure that all

devices maintain up-to-date security patches and updates, including third-party applications, while proactively detecting and mitigating known vulnerabilities. These efforts will help enforce security compliance across all operating systems and improve BOE's overall cybersecurity resilience. Additionally, BOE is planning to upgrade its existing Security Information and Event Management (SIEM) platform to enhance monitoring, detection, and response capabilities.

Firewall Infrastructure Modernization:

BOE is in the process of replacing a legacy firewall appliance with an upgraded solution that will incorporate advanced Intrusion Detection and Prevention Services (IDPS), enhanced logging and monitoring capabilities, and a redundant high-availability system to prevent service disruptions due to hardware failures. This investment will significantly improve our ability to detect and mitigate cyber threats in real-time.

Network Infrastructure Upgrades:

Recognizing the security risks posed by aging network devices, BOE is prioritizing the replacement of all end-of-life infrastructure components identified as potential vulnerabilities. To support this effort, BOE is actively exploring funding opportunities, including grants administered through OCTO and potential resources available from the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) Cybersecurity Grant Program specifically designated for election security.

Additionally, we are seeking to hire a Cyber Security Analyst who will provide critical recommendations to enhance our security posture.

60. Certain voters including victims of domestic violence or cyberstalking may be especially vulnerable if their registration information is leaked. Are there any special considerations for these voters?

RESPONSE:

Yes. The Address Confidentiality Program (ACP) was created through the Address Confidentiality Act of 2018 (D.C. Law 22-118; D.C. Official Code § 4-555.01-555.12). The ACP is a District wide program, administered by the Office of Victim Services and Justice Grants (OVSJG), that provides eligible and vetted individuals with a legal substitute address for interacting with all District agencies. This program helps residents who fear for their safety by shielding their street address from public records, providing one tool in an individual's broader safety plan.

The ACP Coordinator at OVSJG works closely with the Registrar of Voters to ensure the safety and address confidentiality of all ACP participants who are also registered voters. If a voter's address is made confidential through the ACP, their entire registration record is removed from all voter records available for public inspection, including poll books available in any voting place. See Title 3 DCMR § 510.10. The voter can rescind this protection at any time if they wish. Otherwise, it is valid for five years and can be extended as needed. ACP voters are advised of the best methods for registering/updating

their voting registration, signing petitions, and voting, so that their address remains confidential.

Additionally, if a voter does not qualify for the ACP, a voter could alternatively present reasonable written evidence directly to the Registrar demonstrating that they have at any time been a victim of a covered offense or covered employee, as defined in the Address Confidentiality Act of 2018. This evidence may include employment, court, law enforcement, medical, or social service records. See Title 3 DCMR § 510.19(b). A voter could also provide a copy of a court order to the Registrar directing the confidentiality of the voter's address. See Title 3 DCMR § 510.19(a).

61. District of Columbia Code § 1–1001.05(a)(8) requires the Board of Elections to redraw precinct lines every 5 five years. Please describe this process, indicating when precinct lines were last drawn and noting any administrative challenges to fulfilling this requirement.

RESPONSE:

The process of redrawing precinct lines, as required by District of Columbia Code § 1-1001.05(a)(8), typically involves a thorough review of the existing precinct boundaries, population distribution, and other relevant factors, such as changes in census data, demographic shifts, and accessibility needs. The goal is to ensure that each precinct has a roughly equal number of voters. The most recent precinct line adjustments were made following the 2020 U.S. Census, and the new boundaries were implemented in time for the 2022 elections.

Step 1: Analyze the Data:

- Collect and evaluate existing demographic, geographic, and voting data to determine the need for precinct boundary adjustments.
- Use data from sources such as the U.S. Census Bureau and DC's GIS team to assess population shifts, changes in voter turnout, and other relevant factors.

Step 2: Collaboration with Key Stakeholders

Utilize data from sources such as the U.S. Census Bureau, the Geographic Information Systems (GIS) team, and the Office of Planning to assess population shifts and obtain the necessary data, maps, and geographic information.

Step 3: Precinct Mapping

BOE creates an initial draft of the new precinct boundaries. The proposed lines aim to maintain fairness and compliance with all legal and regulatory requirements. The draft precinct boundaries are submitted to the Board for review and approval.

Step 4: Implementation and Notification

- Once the proposed changes are approved, BOE implements the new precinct boundaries in the voter registration system.
- Voters are notified of the changes to their precinct assignments

Some administrative challenges in fulfilling this requirement include:

1. Accurate Data and Mapping: Gathering and analyzing up-to-date data, such as voter population trends and geographic changes, can be a lengthy and complex process. This often requires coordination with various stakeholders such as Office of Planning, the U.S. Census Bureau, and OCTO GIS specialists.

2. Logistical Coordination: Implementing the new precinct boundaries in time for elections involves updating voter registration data, adjusting polling locations, and ensuring that all necessary materials (such as ballots, polling locations, and voting equipment) aligned with the new boundaries.

62. Please describe how the Board determines the number of Vote Centers within the District of Columbia. Is the Board considering creating any new Vote Centers?

RESPONSE:

BOE has process for determining the location and number of Vote Centers within the District of Columbia. The considered factors include:

- Geographic positioning throughout each Ward
- Voting population
- Anticipated voting activity due to Ward races
- Proximity to public transportation
- Space to accommodate proper social distancing
- Accessibility under Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) guidelines
- Curbside voting alternatives

There are no current plans to increase the number of Vote Centers. However, we examine and assess the placement of Vote Centers after each election. We will engage in the process ahead of the 2026 Election Cycle.

63. The Board of Elections has previously indicated that the website would be moved from <http://www.dcboe.org> to a .gov site in order to ensure that the website is recognized as a trusted government site. Please provide an update to this move.

RESPONSE:

The Board of Elections submitted its application for a .GOV domain on December 31, 2024. The agency is currently moving along in the process, which consists of fourteen critical steps, and we have completed 6. The Board has met with our Election Security Advisor & CISA Team, who provide guidance and assurance that BOE is following the correct path to obtaining and transitioning to a .GOV domain. This also includes providing the status of our request for a .GOV and if any further questions to the Board are needed before final approval. Gov domain.

The Board has already begun conversations with OCTO's Chief Information Security Officer (CISO) & Deputy CISO, BOE's Website and email vendor, and

other stakeholders that may have an impact on our migration, which is part of the discovery phase to identify other technical upgrades which may be required or needed as we transition to the .GOV domain.

The Board, as of today, is still waiting for final approval of its GOV domain name. In the meantime, we are working with our website/email vendor and other stakeholders to obtain the costs associated with this project and time frames based on our findings of all services and equipment needed to complete our migration. We have a tentative date for migrating our email platform and website on October 1, 2025. Our old email domain, @dcboe.org, will still be available a year after the migration in order to allow the public to make changes in its contract for the new email domain change. So, if anyone is forwarding the email to a @dcboe.org domain, it will be submitted to the new email address. Also, an email to the sender informing them of the change. The new email domain will be posted to the public on our website and social media platforms.

64. Please describe the BOE's efforts to increase polling place accessibility in FY24 and FY25 to date. Did the Board receive any complaints regarding accessibility in the 2024 general or primary elections? If so, please summarize the complaint and describe any actions the Board took or is taking to remedy the complaint.

RESPONSE:

BOE implemented significant measures to enhance polling place accessibility during Fiscal Years 2024 and 2025. Before the FY24 elections, BOE collaborated with disability rights advocacy groups, including Disability Rights DC at University Legal Services, to address accessibility issues. The American with Disabilities Act ("ADA") Coordinator trained election workers serving as Voter Assistance Clerks on Title II of the ADA, focusing on compliance, awareness, disability etiquette, and in the proper set up of voting machines in compliance with ADA standards. The training curriculum was enhanced to emphasize practical application. The ADA Coordinator surveyed all twenty-five early vote centers to verify accessibility. An ADA Compliance Team, comprised of eighteen trained election workers, assisted in inspecting all seventy-five vote centers on Election Day. Temporary modifications, such as ramps, were installed at specific locations, including Barry Farms Recreation Center and Columbia Heights Recreation Center, to address structural challenges. Additionally, the ADA Coordinator evaluated the accessibility of fifty-five ballot drop boxes citywide.

During the early voting period for the primary election, the Board received a complaint that an individual who appeared at an early voting center with his emotional support dog (identified as such by the complainant) was told that he could not have an animal with him in the voting center and was otherwise treated inappropriately under ADA laws concerning service animals. Upon receiving the complaint, BOE's ADA Coordinator went to the location and reiterated to the election workers serving there the legally appropriate protocols for handling voters with animals at voting locations, protocols which election workers had been informed of during training. In a subsequent discussion with representatives from the U.S. Attorney's Office for the District of Columbia who were

investigating the matter, the Board provided information on the incident and subsequently shared materials from its training on accessibility that touched upon the legally appropriate protocols for handling voters with animals. The matter was closed without the Board being penalized as a result of the alleged incident.

Outside of polling place accessibility, BOE established an accessibility hotline, and included the following language about the same in the Voter Guide: "If you need a reasonable accommodation to vote, have questions concerning these services, or would like to receive this information in an alternative language or format (e.g., braille, large print), please email the ADA/Language Access Coordinator at ada@dcboe.org or call (202) 727-5411 (711 TTY)." The hotline was operational from 8 am to 7 pm, with calls forwarded to the ADA Coordinator's BOE cell phone.

Also, during the 2024 election cycle, BOE introduced the Accessible Remote Ballot (ARB) with an Electronic Ballot Return feature, allowing eligible voters with disabilities to submit ballots electronically via the secure Omni Ballot portal. This initiative saw increased use from previous years, with over 30 voters utilizing the portal.

65. Please describe the metrics used to measure the accessibility of a polling place. Are these metrics available to the public to determine which locations may be most accessible for their needs?

RESPONSE:

The primary metric used by the BOE to evaluate polling place accessibility is whether voters with disabilities have unobstructed access to the ballot box. To ensure this, the BOE employs a comprehensive set of metrics that cover various aspects of accessibility, allowing all voters, including those with disabilities, to participate in the electoral process with ease and dignity. These metrics begin with physical accessibility, where the BOE evaluates entrance and exit accessibility by assessing ramps, door widths, and automatic door openers to ensure compliance with ADA standards. Pathways leading to and within the polling place are assessed to ensure they are free of obstructions and have appropriate signage. Additionally, voting booths are verified to be at an accessible height and have sufficient space for wheelchair users.

Operational accessibility is another critical area of focus. The BOE ensures the availability of assistive devices, such as magnifying glasses and audio ballots, for voters with visual impairments. Trained election workers are deployed to assist voters with disabilities and provide necessary accommodations, enhancing the overall voting experience. Communication accessibility is also prioritized. The BOE provides clear and accessible signage, along with information in multiple formats, such as braille and large print, to guide voters effectively. By employing these metrics, the BOE strives to create an inclusive voting environment that accommodates the diverse needs of all voters.

66. Please provide an update to any improvements designed for the facility designated for public viewing of the ballot counting process. Did the Board receive any complaints regarding public viewing of elections procedures in 2024? If so, please summarize the complaint and describe any actions the Board took or is taking to remedy the complaint.

RESPONSE:

BOE has a scheduled meeting with the Department of General Services (DGS) to discuss tenant improvements to the leased space dedicated to mail ballot processing. BOE has begun the process of installing cameras and creating a dedicated viewing area to observe mail ballot processing.

BOE received no formal complaints regarding public viewing of elections procedures in 2024. However, staff at BOE have been harassed and verbally assaulted when we have not allowed members of the public to access restricted areas. We have also received informal complaints when we enforce procedures that are in place to protect the security and integrity of the election process.

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1 INTRODUCTION

This document presents the Fiscal Year 2025 Performance Plan for the D.C. Board of Elections.

This Performance Plan is the first of two agency performance documents published each year. The Performance Plan is published twice annually – preliminarily in March when the Mayor’s budget proposal is delivered, and again at the start of the fiscal year when budget decisions have been finalized. A companion document, the Performance Accountability Report (PAR), is published annually in January following the end of the fiscal year. Each PAR assesses agency performance relative to its annual Performance Plan.

Performance Plan Structure: Performance plans are comprised of agency Objectives, Administrative Structures (such as Divisions, Administrations, and Offices), Activities, Projects and related performance measures. The following describes these plan components, and the types of performance measures agencies use to assess their performance.

Objectives: Objectives are statements of the desired benefits that are expected from the performance of an agency’s mission. They describe the goals of the agency.

Administrative Structures: Administrative Structures represent the organizational units of an agency, such as Departments, Divisions, or Offices.

Activities: Activities represent the programs and services an agency provides. They reflect what an agency does on a regular basis (e.g., processing permits).

Projects: Projects are planned efforts that end once a particular outcome or goal is achieved.

Measures: Performance Measures may be associated with any plan component, or with the agency overall. Performance Measures can answer broad questions about an agency’s overall performance or the performance of an organizational unit, a program or service, or the implementation of a major project. Measures can answer questions like “How much did we do?”, “How well did we do it?”, “How quickly did we do it?”, and “Is anyone better off?” as described in the table below. Measures are printed throughout the Performance Plan, as they may be measuring an objective, an administrative structure, an activity, or be related to the agency performance as a whole.

Measure Type	Measure Description	Example
Quantity	Quantity measures assess the volume of work an agency performs. These measures can describe the inputs (e.g., requests or cases) that an agency receives or the work that an agency completes (e.g., licenses issued or cases closed). Quality	Quality measures assess how well an agency’s work meets standards, specifications, resident needs, or resident expectations. Agencies set targets for most performance measures before the start of the fiscal year. Targets may represent goals, requirements, or national standards for a performance measure. Agencies strive to achieve targets each year, and agencies provide explanations for targets that are not met at the end of the fiscal year in the subsequent Performance Accountability Report. Not all measures are associated with a target. For example, newly added measures do not require targets for the first year, as agencies determine a data-informed benchmark. Additionally, change in some quantity or context measures and District-wide indicators may not indicate better or worse performance, but are "neutral" measures of demand or input, or are outside of the agency's direct control. Completing the DC Voter Registration Application for Incarcerated Citizens

In 2020, the District of Columbia enacted the "Restore the Vote" Act.
 This allows eligible incarcerated DC residents to register and vote in District of Columbia elections, regardless of the offense!

Instructions for completing your DC Voter Registration Application

Block	Notes
1	There are two application forms; one for US citizens and another for non-US citizens. Please be sure you are completing the correct form based on your US citizenship status.
2	Indicate your reason for completing the form (i.e., new registration, address change, etc.). Ignore the gray shaded area (Voter ID, Reg. Date, Clerk).
3	Include your full name in the provided boxes. If you are incarcerated under a different name (alias) than known to the District, our mail may not be accepted by the correctional facility. Therefore, please provide the alias in parentheses. For example, (aka John Doe).
4	Include your DC residential address (address where you lived prior to incarceration or a DC address for which you claim residency and will be returning to after release). This must be a DC address.
5	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Include your BOP register number or jail ID number in this field. If you wish to receive your ballot and other Board of Elections mail at your correctional facility, put the mailing address of the facility in this box. Be sure to update your address information if you are released or move to a different facility by filling out a new registration application.
6	Include date of birth, including year (example: 08/20/1954).
7	Optional – Daytime phone number.
8	Provide either a DMV issued ID number OR the last 4 digits of your social security number if you do not have or do not know your DMV ID. If you have neither, check box 8a and a unique identifier will be assigned to you that will allow you to register.
9	You may choose to register with one of DC's major political parties. In order to vote on a candidate in a Primary Election, you must be registered with one of the major parties. The major parties are the Democratic Party, Republican Party, and DC Statehood Green Party. If you do not select a major party, you will be considered 'no party (independent)'. Keep in mind, if you're registered as Independent, you cannot vote on a candidate in a Primary Election. All registered voters, regardless of party affiliation, are eligible to vote in general and special elections.
10	Optional – If you need help with voting, indicate the type of help you need. Be as specific as possible and the Board of Elections will work with your correctional facility to provide needed accommodations.
11	Optional – Include your primary language, if not English.
12	Optional – Include the name and address of the last voter registration address, if applicable.
13	Every bullet should be true. If so, sign and date. The application must be signed and dated.

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs) Voter Registration for Incarcerated DC Residents in the Bureau of Prisons (BOP)

Does my offense prevent me from being eligible to register and vote in the District of Columbia?

No. Your offense does not prevent you from being eligible to vote in DC. As an incarcerated citizen in the BOP, you are eligible to vote in DC if:

- You are a DC Resident
- No judge has ruled that you are incapable of voting
- You do not claim voting residence or the right to vote in another U.S. state or territory.

Can I register and vote in DC if I'm not a US citizen?

Yes. If you meet the eligibility criteria stated above, you can register and vote in DC. There are two registration application forms; one for US citizens and another for non-US citizens. Please be sure you are completing the correct form based on your US citizenship status. Non-US citizens do not vote in federal elections, but can vote in local elections.

Can I register and vote in DC if I'm not a DC resident?

No. You must be a DC resident to register and vote in DC; however, you do not lose your DC residency status if you are currently incarcerated outside of the District of Columbia.

How do I get a voter registration application?

You can print a voter registration application from TRULINCS. Staff may have access to hardcopy registration forms or may download an application from the DC Board of Elections website (www.dcboe.org). You can also request to have a voter registration application sent to you by the DC Board of Elections. You can request via email at outreachspecialist@dcboe.org or by writing to the Board at: DC Board of Election, 1015 Half St. SE, Suite 750, Washington, DC 20003. Email is preferred as it will provide the quickest response.

What should I use as my residential address (box 4) on the voter registration application?

Use the DC address that you had prior to incarceration or another DC address where you plan to return after release. The address you use in box 4 will determine the ballot you receive for local elections. Therefore, if you want to vote for a Ward 8 candidate (e.g., Advisory Neighborhood Commissioner), your residential address must be a Ward 8 address.

What should I use as my mailing address (box 5) on the voter registration application?

While incarcerated, you will want your mail (e.g., voter registration card and ballot) to come directly to you. Therefore, you should use the mailing address for where you are incarcerated, otherwise, your mail will go to the address you used in box 4. Be sure to include your BOP ID number in this box as well.

What if I'm incarcerated in the BOP under a different name (I have an alias)?

You must register with the name known to the District. If you are incarcerated under a different name not known to us, it's likely your mail will not be accepted by the BOP. Therefore, put your alias in box 3 of the voter registration application in parentheses. Use this example, Smith (aka John Doe).

What if I need special assistance with voting?

Indicate in box 10 if you need any assistance with voting. Please be as specific as possible. The Board of Elections will work with the BOP to provide any reasonable accommodations.

Where do I put my Register Number on the Voter Registration Application?

Box 5. Place your Register Number in the mailing address field (mailing address where you get your mail), along with the other address information.

What happens if I don't sign the voter registration application?

If you do not sign the voter registration application, it cannot be processed. You should make sure everything in the voter declaration section is true and then sign and date.

What happens if I don't provide a DMV ID or the last four digits of my Social Security Number (SSN)?

If you do not have either a DMV ID or a SSN, indicate that in box 8a and a unique identifier will be assigned to you which will allow you to register and vote.

I've just been released from incarceration or will soon be released. What should I do to make sure I will receive my mail and ballot from DC Board of Elections?

Please complete a voter registration application with your new address. The Board of Elections cannot get your mail to you if we do not know your new address.

I am being transferred to another facility. What should I do to make sure I will receive my mail and ballot from DC Board of Elections?

Please complete a voter registration application with your new address. The Board of Elections cannot get your mail to you if we do not know your new address.

How can I check on my registration?

The Board of Elections will mail you a registration card upon your successful registration. You can also have someone check our website for your status at <https://dcboe.org/Voters/Register-To-Vote/Check-Voter-Registration-Status>. They will need your first and last name, your date of birth and the zip code of your DC residence. You can also email us at outreachspecialist@dcboe.org.

Is mail from the Board of Elections considered legal mail?

Yes and no. Your official ballot is to be treated as legal by the BOP; however, all other incoming correspondence will be treated as regular mail. All mail that you send to the BOE is considered legal mail.

How can I get information about the political parties or specific candidates?

The Board of Elections must remain neutral; therefore, we're unable to provide you specific information about parties or candidates. We suggest you reach out to a source you trust, for example family or friends.

What is the difference between a Primary Election and General Election?

A Primary Election is one where registered voters vote for the candidates that will represent their party in the General Election. The General Election is when voters vote on who will actually win the political office (i.e., Mayor, Council Member, etc.). DC has closed Primaries, meaning you can only vote on candidates in the party for which you are registered. For example, if you're registered with the DC Statehood Green Party, your primary ballot will only contain DC Statehood Green candidates, so you will only be able to vote for candidates in the DC Statehood Green Party. It also means you MUST be registered with one of the three major parties in order to vote on a candidate in a Primary Election. The three parties are the Democratic Party, Republican Party, and D.C. Statehood Green Party. If you do not select a major party, you will be considered 'no party (independent)' and cannot vote on a candidate in a primary election.

What should I do if I have a question not listed above?

Since the passage of the Restore the Vote Amendment Act of 2020 (RTV), District of Columbia residents do not lose their voting rights due to a felony conviction.

Whether you are currently incarcerated or have been released, your right to vote is the same as any District of Columbia resident.

There are some steps you need to take to vote. (Please see the *Voting in the District of Columbia* pamphlet that accompanies this Guide. It provides helpful information to complete the Voter Registration Application.)

- ✓ You must register to vote if you are not already registered.
- ✓ If you were already registered to vote and convicted of a felony prior to the implementation of the RTV, your voting rights may have been taken from you, therefore you may need to re-register. Please contact the DCBOE or our website to check your status.
- ✓ If you registered to vote using a correctional facility as a mailing address and have since been released from custody or your residential address has changed, you must update your registration information.
- ✓ If you are already registered and recently released, and Election Day is near, your ballot may be mailed to your place of incarceration. However, you can still vote at any Vote Center during Early Voting or on Election Day.

REGISTERING AND VOTING AS AN INCARCERATED DC RESIDENT

YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO VOTE IN THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA

As a District of Columbia resident, you have the right to vote, even if you are incarcerated.

Even if you are in a correctional facility outside of the District of Columbia, if you are registered, you do not lose your residency status and you have the right to vote.

Once you are properly registered, you will be mailed a ballot prior to any District of Columbia election for which you are eligible.

If your ballot was mailed to your place of incarceration and you were released prior to receiving it, you can still vote at any Vote Center during Early Voting or on Election Day.

HELPFUL TIPS

If you do not currently have a District of Columbia address (that is, no family currently resides in the city), but are still returning to the District of Columbia upon release, you may use either your last known address or the address to which you plan to return, on the Voter Registration Application.

Use the correctional facility address in the mailing address section on the registration application to notify the DC Board of Elections that is where you want your ballot delivered.

WHAT TO DO AFTER YOUR RELEASE

Once you are released from a correctional facility, **you should update your address with the DC Board of Elections by completing another Voter Registration Application and checking the "Address Change" box.**

REGISTERING WITH A POLITICAL PARTY AND VOTING IN PRIMARY ELECTIONS

If you wish to vote for a candidate in a primary election, you must register with one of the major parties that conduct a primary election in the District.

Currently, the three major parties are the Democratic, Republican, and DC Statehood Green.

You may also register as "No Party" (Independent), or check the "Other" box to register with a minor party. Only those registered with one of the major parties may vote in primary elections; however, all voters may vote in the General Election or any Special Election.

VOTING RIGHTS

You do not lose your District of Columbia residency status because you are residing in a correctional facility, even outside of the District.

In 2020, the District of Columbia passed legislation giving all incarcerated residents, regardless of their conviction, the right to register to vote and cast a ballot.

Please note, if you were convicted of a felony before 2020, and if you have not already, you will need to register to vote again.

VOTER ELIGIBILITY

To register to vote in the District of Columbia, you must:

- ✓ Be a United States citizen to vote in federal elections. Non-citizens may vote in local elections;
- ✓ Be a resident of the District of Columbia;
- ✓ Maintain residency in the District of Columbia for at least 30 days prior to the election in which you intend to vote;
- ✓ Not claim voting residence or the right to vote in another US state, territory, or country;



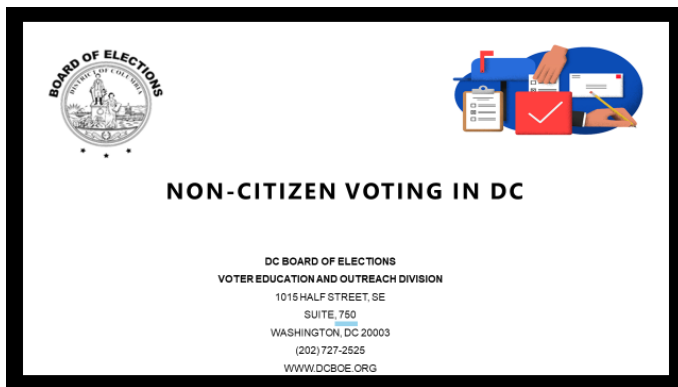

- ✓ Not claim voting residence or the right to vote in any state, territory, or country
- ✓ Not been found by a court to be legally incompetent to vote



INFORMATION NEEDED TO REGISTER

- ✓ Full Name
- ✓ District Address
- ✓ Date of Birth
- ✓ Register with an eligible party,
 - Democratic, Republican, or D.C. Statehood Green (can vote in Primary elections)
 - Independent (can **only** vote in General elections)



PROOF OF RESIDENCE

- A copy of a current and valid government-issued photo identification
- A copy of a current utility bill, bank statement, government check, or paycheck (dated no earlier than 90 days before the date upon which you mail your application or, if you do not submit proof by mail or online, 90 days before the date you vote)
- Any other government-issued document

- In person
- Online → www.dcboe.org
- Mail
- Email → DCRegistration@dcboe.org
- Same-Day → during Early Voting and on Election Day



WHERE TO VOTE

Return the Ballot Mailed to You

- All eligible registered voters will be mailed a ballot prior to the election.

During Early Voting

You may vote in person at any of the Early Vote Centers, which are open from 8:30am to 7:00pm.

At a Vote Center on Election Day

You may vote in person at any of the Vote Centers, which are open daily from 7:00am to 8:00pm.



FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What political parties are recognized in DC?

- Republican Party
- Democratic Party
- D.C. Statehood Green Party

Is voter registration information public?

Yes, with the exception of full/partial social security numbers, voter registration numbers, dates of birth, email addresses, and telephone numbers. Other information may also be held confidential as prescribed by federal and/or District law.



CAN I REGISTER TO VOTE SAME DAY FOR EARLY VOTING OR ON ELECTION DAY ?

Yes!

You must provide proof of your address in the District of Columbia at an Early Vote Center prior to Election Day, or at a Vote Center on Election Day.



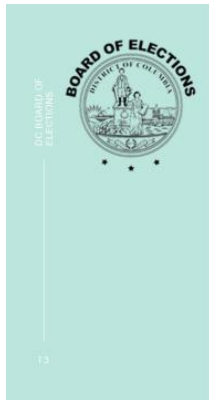

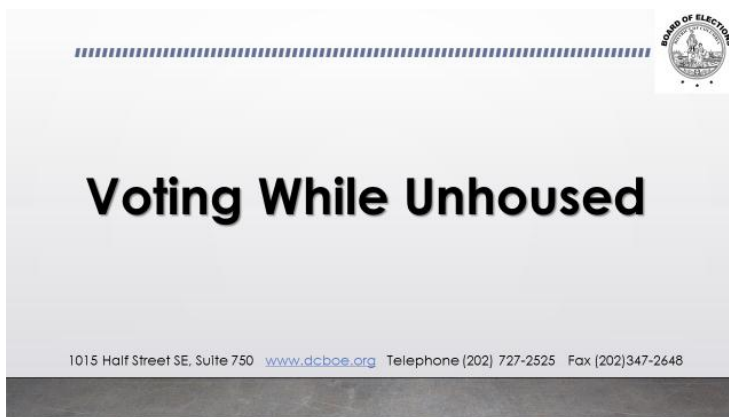

Who Can Vote

- U.S. Citizens
- 17 year olds (if they will be 18 years old by Election Day)
- Have been a District of Columbia resident for at least 30 days
- Returning Citizens
- Non-U.S. Citizens (local elections only)
- If you are not found by a court to be legally incompetent to vote



Requirements to Register to Vote

- Be at least 16 years old
- Be a United States Citizen
- Be a resident of the District of Columbia
- Maintain residency in the District of Columbia for at least 30 days
- Not claim voting residence or the right to vote in another U.S. State territory, or country
- Not have been found by a court to be legally incompetent to vote

* Must be submitted no later than 21 days before the election



No Address, No Problem

A traditional residence is not required, and one may list the place where they consider their residence, or where they sleep at night, which can include a **shelter**, or even a **bench in the park**.



Where to Vote

Return the Ballot Mailed to you

All eligible registered District of Columbia voters will be mailed a ballot prior to each Election. Completed ballots can be returned to a **Mail Ballot Drop Box**, **US Postal Service**, or to any **Vote Center**.

Vote Center

You may vote in person at any Vote Center.

Language Interpretation

All Vote Centers will be equipped with a Language line (audio only)

- Visual interpreter
- American sign Language interpreter
- Translated ballots



Accessible Vote Centers

- Accessible Vote Centers (accessible entrances, elevators, ramps and passenger drop off areas)
- Curbside voting (voters 65+ or any person with a disability)
- Accessible voting technology (touch screen display, instruction panel, headphones, audio tactile pad with braille and a sip-and-puff device)





Election Worker Program

The Election Worker Program recruits and trains individuals to staff a vote center ensuring that elections are conducted smoothly, fairly and efficiently.

All Elections Workers are required to attend and pass a mandatory 4-hour training class to become an Election Worker.

Positions:

- Registration Clerk
- Ballot Clerk
- Voter assistance clerk
- Site Coordinator

Election Worker Stipend:

Early Voting = \$100.00 (per shift)
Election Day = \$200.00
