Council Chairman Phil Mendelson announces a public hearing before the Committee of the Whole on Bill 26-62, the "Board of Trustees Training Amendment Act of 2025." The hearing will be held at 2:00 p.m. on Wednesday, March 26, 2025.

Bill 26-62 aims to require the Public Charter School Board, in collaboration with the Office of the State Superintendent of Education, to provide a no-cost training program for newly elected or appointed members of a public charter school's Board of Trustees. Governance lapses—particularly in financial management—have jeopardized the stability of charter schools in the District, leading to closures that disrupt students' education. On August 20, 2024, the Board of Eagle Academy announced its decision to surrender the school's charter, effective immediately. This abrupt closure displaced 362 students and left employees without a school just one week before the academic year began. Such disruptions not only displace students from their school communities but also hinder academic progress, impact well-being, and erode public trust in both schools and the government. They also create uncertainty about the ability of schools to provide consistent, high-quality education. The incident has heightened concerns regarding financial oversight and board training within the charter school sector. This hearing seeks comments on Bill 26-62, as well as, to assess the need for enhanced training programs for charter school board members to strengthen governance and ensure greater financial accountability.

Testimony is limited to three minutes. We will make every effort to fulfill timely requests, although alternatives may be offered. Requests received in less than five business days may not be fulfilled. Public witnesses will participate in-person or virtually via the Internet on the Zoom Video Conference platform.
