Councilmember Brooke Pinto A PROPOSED RESOLUTION IN THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA To declare the existence of an emergency with respect to the need to amend the Second Chance Amendment Act of 2022 to clarify the timeline for the automatic sealing of nonconvictions. RESOLVED, BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this resolution may be cited as the "Second Chance Clarification Emergency Declaration Resolution of 2025". Sec. 2. (a) D.C. Law 24-284, the Second Chance Amendment Act of 2022 ("Second Chance"), was enacted in 2023 to expand the categories of criminal records and court proceedings eligible for sealing or expungement. (b) Second Chance has subsequently been amended multiple times updating the effective dates, applicability dates, and deadlines for action, in D.C. Law L25-50, the Fiscal Year 2024 Budget Support Act of 2023; D.C. Law 25-175, the Secure DC Omnibus Amendment Act of 2024; and D.C. Law 25-217, the Fiscal Year 2025 Budget Support Act of 2024. (c) The Committee on the Judiciary and Public Safety identified two previous drafting errors in amendatory Section 16-805(c)(1) of Second Chance that would inadvertently move up the timeline of certain provisions of the law by more than two years and would immediately deem the implementing agencies noncompliant for the previous two years. (d) Therefore, emergency legislation is needed to resolve these errors.
