A RESOLUTION

IN THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA

To declare the existence of an emergency with respect to the need to approve Modification No 2 to Contract No. NFPHC-MS-23-C-00054 between the Not-for-Profit Hospital Corporation, commonly known as United Medical Center (“Hospital”), and Northrium Health LLC, for the provision of anesthesia and vascular access, and to authorize payment for the services received and to be received under the Contract.

RESOLVED, BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this resolution may be cited as the “Modification No. 2 to Contract NFPHC-MS-23-C-00054 between the Not-for-Profit Hospital Corporation and Northrium Health LLC, Approval and Payment Authorization Emergency Declaration Resolution of 2025”.

Sec. 2. (a) There exists an immediate need to approve Modification No 2 to Contract No. NFPHC-MS-23-C-00054 (“Contract”) between the Not-for-Profit Hospital Corporation (“Hospital”) and Northrium Health LLC, for the provision of anesthesia and vascular access services, and to authorize payment for the services received and to be received under this Contract.

37 (b) The Base Year agreement was approved by Council in the amount of
38 \$1,810,430.96 for the period of August 1, 2023 through July 31, 2024 (CA25-327).

39 (c) Option Year 1 (August 1, 2024 – March 31, 2025) was approved by Council
40 on October 1, 2024 for \$1,025,910.99 as A25-0577.

41 (d) Delaying the hospital’s closure from the originally planned date of March 31,
42 2025, to April 15, 2025, to align with the opening of Cedar Hill Regional Medical Center
43 and avoid a gap in services, resulted in the need to extend UMC’s engagement with
44 Northrium for anesthesia and vascular services.

45 (e) If Proposed Modification #2 is approved for \$64,119.43, the revised total
46 retroactive value of the Option Year 1 (August 1, 2024 – April 15, 2025) would have an
47 aggregate value of \$1,090,303.42 to ensure uninterrupted anesthesia and vascular access
48 services, and would have an aggregate value that exceeds \$1 million in a 12-month
49 period and therefore Council approval is necessary.

50 (f) Without this approval, Northrium Health LLC cannot be paid for the critical
51 services provided and to be provided in excess of \$999,999.99.

52 Sec. 3. The Council determines that the circumstances enumerated in section 2
53 constitute emergency circumstances making it necessary that Modification No. 2 to
54 Contract NFPHC-MS-23-C-00054 between the Not-for-Profit Hospital Corporation and
55 Northrium Health LLC. Approval and Payment Authorization Emergency Act of 2025,
56 be adopted after a single reading.

57 Sec. 4. This resolution shall take effect immediately.
