  - e. Attendance record; and
  - f. For any vacant seats, how long the seat has been vacant.
2. Please provide a list of the Commission's meeting dates, times, and locations for FY25 and FY26, to date.
3. Please identify any experts or agency staff who presented or held discussions during the Commission's quarterly public meetings in FY25 and FY26, to date, including:
  - a. Their name;
  - b. The agency or organization they represent; and
  - c. Date of meeting attended.
4. Did the Commission receive funds in FY25 and FY26, to date? If so, please provide the following:
  - a. The amount of funding;
  - b. The source of the funding;
