Building off of recent success with SAV restoration in both waterbodies, DOEE will install several SAV restoration plot "enclosures" planted with seedlings and seeds of <i>Vallisneria spiralis</i> (wild celery), a native SAV species. The objective is to create healthy beds of SAV within these enclosures which will in turn lead to dispersal of SAV in areas adjacent to the plots. Enclosures are fabricated, installed and maintained by DOEE staff. These enclosures are designed to reduce predation by waterfowl and fish, and maximize growth of native SAV species. DOEE Biologists will use a boat to annually monitor the SAV growth within the enclosures and within the restoration perimeter by ground-truthing SAV cover density at the peak of the growing season.
